In his 14 years at the Sun-Sentinel, Jon covered many of South Florida's biggest stories from the butterfly ballot controversy in the 2000 presidential election to the spectacular collapse of Fort Lauderdale lawyer Scott Rothstein's \$1.2 billion Ponzi scheme. Jon was part of the Sun-Sentinel team that won some of journalism's top honors in 2005 for its sweeping investigation into the Federal Emergency Management Agency's gross mismanagement of disaster relief funds. Jon has appeared on numerous television shows, including Comedy Central's "The Colbert Report," CNBC's "American Greed: The Fugitives" and ABC's "Good Morning America." Jon grew up in Arizona and graduated from the University of Arizona with degrees in journalism and political science.
