- **4. Discussion**: A need to have a strategic planning and more participation, How do we generate the interest to those who need it the most to attend and give their input on the decisions that many need done, Houston Tate, OCR Manager
 - Mr. Gainer, reviewed the last CCRT meeting which turned into a planning meeting on OCR's mission statement and objectives, he explained that we would like to do the same type meeting for November for in South Bay. Turn over to Mr. Tate for overview.
 - Mr. Tate, Planning is crucial to making certain that the organization has information about the direction that it is going. To make certain that Stakeholders are informed in a way that they have ways in which to have a reasonable expectation as to what can occur, what they should do in terms of participation. In order for departments to be effective all parties have to want to work and be effective to solve some of the real issues that face the public today. That's is a part of this planning process. It will help us as a department to obtain a reasonable idea of what this region should need, the key is how do you create the kind of connectivity so that from the County stand point, all County departments can come together and understand what those priorities are and come together to complete those priorities. What is needed here, your help is needed to reach your communities. Responses from your communities are needed on a broad base consensus to determine priorities, way of putting together a team of representation of the entire stakeholders, this will bring about greater results. From this strategic planning, come up with a real voice of this community that says that we are interested in making those improvements in this community, that we have put aside differences philosophically, and we are sharing the need to share resources to work together. I am asking that contact OCR with a list of stakeholders that you feel should be there, and think about the dynamics within your environment that is going to make it effective for you.
 - Q. From the audience? Does GTAC still have the kind of direction set that Comm. Steve has in a problem solving committee?
 - A. H. Tate; what happens is that the rules change because the players change. What I am suggesting is that if you understand the dynamics of looking at past experiences and evaluating it with present realities and then at the same time try to prognosticate what's going to occur in the future, we can't. I want to forget about what we did or didn't do, and I want to see numbers and motivation. When we talk about those type issues during our planning sessions. I want to talk about the need to move forward.
 - Q. From the audience (couldn't hear intro)? Taking into consideration Tallahassee, what is our comprehensive planning and outside of our

comprehensive planning that we have, all those mainstream activities to make all that happen.

A. There are many pieces in terms of participation, the Municipal participation which is a different part then the community. There are many pieces that the community may not be aware of the number of programs that the County has and as a result the Glades have not been participating in receiving their share of those resources. That's the beauty having the planning meetings is to raise issues and to identify what priorities are. OCR wants to be able to filter what your concerns are and to coordinate those concerns those concerns, with those players that can assist us with that.

Mr. Tate, what we need to do is suggest that we look at a documented effort, evaluate that to determine whether we are effective or not.

Mr. Tate, What I am really trying to do and what I am listening for at this moment, is to make sure that I do the best job I can of being conclusive with those who should participate.
