- I. The CARE Council Meeting was called to order at 2:30pm by Chair, Rafael Abadia, at the Mayme Fredrick Building. Roll was taken; a quorum was present. Guests were introduced.
- **II.** A Moment of Reflection:

Moment of Silence

Let us have the strength to make the decisions that will improve the care of those we serve. Let us be thankful for what we have accomplished to date.

- V. Motion by Mary Kannel, second by Larry Osband to accept the April 29, 2013 CARE Council Meeting Minutes as presented. Motion carried.

- VI. Comments by the Chair: The Chair of the CARE Council received a letter requesting to join a national movement against the Criminalization of HIV. The committee went through the legal recommendation process; as a committee, we can make a recommendation to the County. This task would be assigned to the Planning Committee to draft a letter and bring to the CARE Council.
- VII. Public Comments: There was none.
- VIII. Educational Moment: Vicki Tucci gave an informative presentation on the Affordable Care Act. Vicki noted that the State's role is to create an American Health Benefit Exchange and a Small Business Health Options Program (SHOP) Exchange for individuals and small businesses and provide oversight of health plans with regard to the new insurance market regulations, consumer protection, rate review, solvency, reserve fund requirements, premium taxes, and to define rating areas.

IX. Standing Reports & Updates:

- A. Legislative Update: Vicki Tucci -There was no report.
- B. **Health Care Reform:** Nadia Najarro –There was no report.
- C. **CPP Updates:** Rob Scott reported that the next CPP meeting would be held on Friday, July 12, 2013, from 10:00am to 12:00 noon, everyone is welcome.
- D. **ADAP Update:** Mitchell Durant gave an overview on the ADAP updates, it was noted that currently as of May 17, 2013, there are there are 1,330 clients in the ADAP program.
- E. **Patient Care & 4BNWK Report and Part B Report:** Mitchell Durant gave an overview on the balance sheets of the Patient Care & 4BNWK and Part B Report. Mitch noted that this is their 1st year as lead agency; Part B had money left over, approximately \$10,000 remaining from a six-month contract. The new fiscal year began April 1, 2013.
- F. **MAC Report:** Metris Batts provided the committee with a list of the National HIV Observance Days Conference call list. Metris informed the committee of the upcoming events with dates and times.
- G. Patient Care Update including ADAP: Mitchell Durant gave the committee an overview on the County Health Department performance snapshot; Mitch noted that 85% of clients who routinely pick-up ADAP medications each month in 2011. He stated the percent of new HIV positives with documentation of linkage to medical care within 90 days of diagnosis; however, the date is not available until 2014.
- H. Medicaid Report: Cindy Barnes- There was no report.
- I. Part A Report: Sonja Holbrook gave the committee updates from Part A.
 - Sonja reported that our IT department developed an Eligibility Module. The
 Eligibility Workgroup participated in a demonstration of the module last week. They
 were pleased with the tool. This will result in more consistency across all eligibility
 screenings and functions as a checklist.
 - Monitoring schedules are being confirmed with our providers. For many of our
 providers we are combining fiscal, program and SOC reviews to be completed at the
 same time to lessen the burden on the providers. A system-wide summary of the
 monitoring will be provided to the CC.
 - We are continuing to work with the State to make improvements to CAREWare. One specific improvement is that we will soon be able to run reports showing the agency

- site locations where clients are receiving services. This will result you being able to better plan for services. We are considering how to use this data in a GIS map. Currently we provide GIS mapping for known cases, shaded by level of impact, and includes markers for the provider locations.
- We were selected as one of four areas in the state to participate in a research project being completed by Research Triangle International (RTI). The research project will examine how public health, primary care, and community organizations work together as a system to identify, enroll in care, and follow HIV patients.
- The needs assessment is underway, gathering surveys. We currently have 180 of the 366 surveys out in the community.
- The Program Manager position was re-advertised last week. Interviews will be scheduled shortly.
- You will be completing the Grantee Assessment in July. The Grantee has been
 working very hard over the past couple of years to meet the CARE Council needs
 and to bring ample information in order for the members to make sound decisions.

- Review expenditure report. March reimbursements are just now being processed since the contracts were approved May 7. Sonja stated that the Grantee office was able to contract 79% of the CARE Council allocations amount, due to only receiving a partial award.
