Fragrant Plants

Mom always would say, "take time to smell the roses". Relaxing in your garden with a variety of scented plants at hand to enjoy is a simple pleasure. Many edible plant species also have strong fragrance, such as, citrus, and of course, herbs and spices.

Some plants release their flower fragrance into the air with the heat of the sun like the Ylang-Ylang, or Michelia trees. If the garden will be used in the evening, include plants that release their fragrance at night, such as Brunsfelsia americana also called the Lady of the Night, confederate and night blooming jasmine.
