## Help

- The unsheltered point-in-time (PIT) count section should be completed using data from the count conducted in the last ten days of January 2011.
- Enter the number of sheltered and unsheltered adults who belong in each subpopulation category.
- As in the Homeless Populations chart, this chart must be completed using statistically reliable and unduplicated counts or estimates of homeless persons based on the point-in-time count conducted during the last ten days of January.
- Only adults should be included in the counts for this chart, except for chronic homeless families and Unaccompanied Children (those under age 18) category.
- Subpopulation data is required for sheltered persons and optional for unsheltered persons, with the exception of chronically homeless individuals, chronically homeless families and veterans.

<sup>b</sup>An unaccompanied homeless adult individual (persons 18 years or older) with a disabiling condition who has either been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had at least four (4) episodes of homelessness in the past three (3) years. To be considered chronically homeless, persons must have been sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation (e.g., living on the streets) and/or in an emergency shelter/safe haven during that time. Disabiling condition is defined as "a diagnosable substance use disorder, serious mental illness, developmental disability, or chronic physical illness or disability, including the co-occurrence of two or more of these conditions." Persons under the age of 18 are not counted as chronically homeless individuals.

<sup>c</sup>A family with at least one adult member (persons 18 or older) who has a disabling condition who has a either been continuously homeless for a year or more OR has had at least four (4) episodes of homelessness in the past three (3) years. To be considered chronically homeless, persons must have been sleeping in a place not meant for human habitation (e.g., living on the streets) and/or in an emergency shelter/safe haven during that time. Disabling condition is defined as "a diagnosable substance use disorder, serious mental illness, developmental disability, or chronic physical illness or disability, including the co-occurrence of two or more of these conditions."

 $^{\rm d}\text{Subpopulation}$  rows only pertain to adults, with the exception of unaccompanied child row.

 $^{\rm e}\text{Count}$  persons in emergency shelters, transitional housing and safe havens in the sheltered count.
