- I. Welcome and Opening Comments Chairman Martz
- II. Introductions were made.
- III. The agenda and minutes were approved by a motion from Dr. Barbara Gerlock and second by Lisa Williams-Taylor.
- IV. Business:
  - a. Becky Walker, COO, Southeast Behavioral Health Network provided an overview of the expanded duties of the Mobile Response Teams. Some of the enhancements include serving individuals under the age of 25 and increased staffing in order to provide a response time under 60 minutes. There was a general discussion about 211. Mrs. Walker noted that SBHN will receive monthly reports from 211 and have regular meetings with them. Data will include the number of calls and referrals for service, as well as caller location.
  - b. The findings to date were reviewed and the committee discussed identifying one issue to address. Suggestions included chronic truancy, low risk kids, and legislative issues such as when parents voluntarily Baker Act children. It was suggested that a Baker Act protocol is needed for the community. The group also thought that it was important to educate parents about what to do when a child needs help. Information can be provided to parents in the orientation packet and distributed to funding agencies. The group decided that it will work on promoting behavioral wellness and a coordinated effort to share this information. FAU will look into branding the message. Tammy Fields will provide information about healthy coping mechanisms.
