- I. Welcome and Opening Comments Chairman Martz
- II. Introductions were made.
- III. The agenda and minutes were approved by a motion from Dr. Barbara Gerlock and second by Tammy Fields.
- IV. Business:
 - a. Branding and Informational Campaign Update Chilondra Sheppard and Reginald Hayes from Palm Beach County Youth Services presented recommendations for the informational campaign from Future Leaders, a youth advisory group for Birth to 22. Suggestions included a pictorial campaign (Happy Space), an interactive app (Great Minds) to examine reoccurring feelings, and All Ears (Early Action Response Space) an online open forum to address frequently asked questions about feelings and emotions in real time. They also suggested having a one hour drill for students and a campaign similar to stop, drop, and roll. Judge Martz mentioned some of the challenges of having drills at schools. Major Griffin-Kitzerow noted that code red drills are held yearly. There was a discussion about providing stop the bleed training for students. Judge Martz also inquired about whether the school apps could provide the same services requested by Future Leaders.
 - b. Vaughn Crichlow, Ph.D., and Cassandra Atkin-Plunk, Ph.D. mentioned that FAU would be conducting a survey for a PBSO grant, and they requested participation from the group. Katherine Shover will provide a copy of the membership list for the survey.
 - c. John Foley, Esq., Legal Aid Society of Palm Beach County provided information about FERPA and HIPAA. He noted that HIPAA is a strong privacy law with robust exceptions for those that could be a threat to public safety. It also allows you to contact the victim and inform them of the threat. FERPA is a broad law with limited emergency exceptions.
 - d. Announcements Judge Martz introduced Ryan Hnatiuk with Senator Scott's Office. Major Griffin-Kitzerow will be leaving the School District Police Department in a week
