- I. Opening comments by Chief Hal Hutchins, Vice Chairman.
  - a. Welcomed Matthew W. Fodor, Assistant Special Agent in Charge, Federal Bureau of Investigation
- II. Roll Call Vice Chairman Hutchins requested that everyone list their name and agency in the chat in lieu of roll call. He reminded everyone to mute their mics.
- III. Introduction of Guests
- IV. The Agenda/Minutes were approved by unanimous consent. Motion was made by Chief Nicholas Caristo and seconded by Chief Brian Smith.
- V. Presentations/Updates
  - a. Major Michael Waites and Detective Supervisor Cecil Wagner, PBC School District Police Department provided an overview of Youth Court and the Juvenile First Offender Program. Detective Wagner mentioned some of the creative solutions that they have implemented due to COVID-19 restrictions. He noted that they work with all agencies in Palm Beach County. Other agencies have JFO programs, but they all filter through their system. They also shared a WPTV interview that highlighted the success of the program. Vice Chairman Hutchins mentioned that there are multiple JFO programs that coordinate with the PBC School Police Department. This process makes the system very successful and beneficial to all that are involved. He also recognized Judge Martz for his work on the School Safety Committee and the JFO program.
  - b. School Safety Grant Presentation: Andrew Pollack, School Safety Grant, Board of Selection, Heather Harer, Executive Director, School Safety Grant, Lee Mandel, CEO and Owner Intralogics, and Richie Perna, Vice President, Business Development, Intralogics Mr. Pollack mentioned that he created the School Safety Grant to help law enforcement have the tools that are needed to prevent future mass violence tragedies. Mr. Mandel explained that agencies that are interested in applying for the grant can visit <a href="https://schoolsafetygrant.org/">https://schoolsafetygrant.org/</a> for additional information. The selection committee meets monthly to review the applications. The committee is comprised of other people that have been effected by these tragedies. They would like to not only help police departments and schools, but also other mass gathering places such as movie theaters, malls, and hospitals. A demo of the software was provided.
  - c. Assistant Special Agent in Charge Matthew W. Fodor, Federal Bureau of Investigation mentioned that he is looking forward to working with the group. Special Agent Hector Tobon, Federal Bureau of Investigation provided an overview of COVID-19 testing scams on the local and national level.



# VI. Liaison Updates

- a. **Data Sharing:** Chief Smith noted that he should have an update by the next Chief's meeting.
- b. Community Engagement Team: Director Herring advised that they recently completed a policing forum in the western part of the county. The next forum for the northern end will be held on April 21st at the FAU John D. MacArthur campus in Jupiter. The last forum on April 28th will be held at the Duncan Theatre at Palm Beach State College. This forum will offer a unique perspective from school and university police departments. She mentioned that the next step is to move into dialogues with the communities.
- c. **SART:** A copy of the SART report was included in the meeting packet.
- d. Coordinated Community Response Team: No report.
- e. **Criminal Justice Institute:** Director Tata advised that there are two academies happening in May. They have eighteen per class due to CDC guidelines with approximately fourteen of those cadets being sponsored by law enforcement agencies.
- f. Communications/Interoperability: No report.
- g. **School Safety:** Judge Martz reported that the <a href="http://awareandcarepbc.com/">http://awareandcarepbc.com/</a> is live now. The site is intended to prevent future tragedies by connecting the community with resources and providing the ability to report suspicious behavior. The mental health committee continues to work on providing a cohesive response to the community. He also mentioned that they are looking at the feasibility of providing video to the PSAPs.
- h. **State Attorney's Office:** Craig Williams advised that they are working to address the issue of uploading body worn camera videos from Special Victim Units by utilizing evidence.com.
- i. Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office: No report.
- j. **Palm Beach County School District Police Department:** Chief Kitzerow thanked everyone that has been involved with Youth Court. He also noted that they have a short turnaround as schools let out in June and start back in August.
