- IV. The agenda and minutes were approved by a motion from Chief Richard Jenkins and second by Chief Sean Brammer, Vice-Chairman.
- V. Presentations/Update

- a. Tammy K. Fields, Director of the Palm Beach County Youth Services Department and Dr. Seth Bernstein, Senior Vice President for Community Investments of the United Way provided information about the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study "ACEs" and the activities of the Birth to 22 committee. ACEs is a public health study that discovered that childhood trauma leads to the adult onset of chronic diseases, depression and other mental illness, violence and being a victim of violence. Several major tasks of the committee were discussed including the Get your Green on Campaign that is held in May to bring awareness to mental health. They also offered to assist law enforcement in preparing a PSA about trauma.
- a. Tate Yeatman, Crime Laboratory Director presented information about the status of the "PRESERVEkit" and "MeToo" at-home sexual assault collection kits. Several states have filed cease and desist orders against these companies and their websites have been suspended. He noted that the PBSO Crime Lab does not consider such at-home kits as viable evidence for prosecution of a criminal case and they won't be accepting or analyzing such kits should they become available in the future. He also advised that these "kits" don't fall under Florida Law (Chapter 2016-72) requiring submission to the lab within 30 days and analysis within 120 days.

  - a. **Data Sharing:** Chief Smith provided an updated about the portal for non-CJIS information. He also noted that they are closely working with the School District.

He also shared about a training day that was held in Delray Beach in which they provided the community with information about body worn cameras, use-of-force and mock traffic stops.
