V. Approval of the minutes of the meeting of February 28, 2013

The February 28, 2013 minutes were approved.

VI. Chairman's Comments

Reminder that the next meeting on April 25<sup>th</sup> will be held at the West Palm Beach Police Department in the Community Room. Chairman Kniffin thanked the West Palm Beach Police Department for hosting the meeting.

- VII. Presentations
  - a. Depositions Lieutenant Kenneth Voiret and Kathryn Hill, Security Technician, of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office & Barbara White, Public Defender's Office, 15<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit

Lt. Voiret presented information on the electronic subpoena system implemented over two years ago at the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office. He acknowledged Kathryn Hill and Barbara White for their assistance with the project. Lt. Voiret explained the process in which Outlook Calendar is used for the transmission of subpoenas by attaching a pdf copy to calendar invites. The system is currently being used with the Public Defender's Office only, but may be branched out to the State Attorney's Office and eventually Traffic Courts. Some of the benefits include relieving a burden on personnel, no cost, ability to track subpoenas, and out of office notifications. They have also significantly reduced the number of no shows that previously averaged about 3 per month to 3 in the past two years all of which had valid excuses. Ms. White shared their experience and success with the system at the Public Defender's Office and offered personal assistance to any agency interested. Questions concerning the process were addressed by Lt. Voiret. Katherine Hatos will e-mail a copy of the presentation and policies.

b. Syringe Exchange Program (House Bill 735/Senate Bill 808) – Hansel Tookes, University of Miami Medical School 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Student

Hansel Tookes introduced his colleague, Edwin Hayes, 4<sup>th</sup> year medical student who will soon be a resident at JFK hospital in Palm Beach County. Mr. Tookes provided information about Syringe Exchange Programs (SEPs) in which sterile syringes are exchanged for used syringes amongst injection drug users. They also provide HIV and hepatitis testing, counseling, and referral to drug treatment. Copies of fact sheets were provided in the packet. According to the Institute of Medicine, syringe exchange programs do not encourage initiation of drug use nor do they increase the frequency of drug use. The presence of these programs in communities does not expand drug networks or increase crime rates. Studies indicate that SEPs reduce accidental needle sticks by law enforcement and the risk to the community from improperly discarded syringes.

House Bill 735 was sponsored by Representative Patrick Pafford of West Palm Beach and passed the House Health Quality Subcommittee. Senate Bill 808 has stalled in the Health Policy Subcommittee chaired by Senator Aaron Bean. The bill was recently amended from a statewide program to using private funds to establish a pilot program in Miami. Representative Patrick Rooney commented about the importance of these programs as a public safety issue and was very supportive of a statewide program. Mr. Tookes requested a letter and calls of support. A motion passed to issue a letter of support as soon as possible for House Bill 735/Senate Bill 808. Chief Kitzerow mentioned that the Florida Police Chiefs Association isn't opposed, but they have already established their legislative priorities. He recommended reaching out to Representative Rooney.

- X. Committee/Workgroup Reports
  - a. Book and Release Committee: No report was presented.
  - b. Recruitment and Retention Committee: Chief Yannuzzi reported that Katherine Hatos has issued an email to request the statistics for this quarter which ends on March 31<sup>st</sup>. He asked if agencies would please respond by the April 11<sup>th</sup> due date.
  - c. Traffic Committee: No report was presented.
  - d. Sexual Assault Response Team: No report was presented.
  - e. Sex Offender Population: No report was presented.
  - f. Court Systems Task Force: No report was presented.
  - g. Property Crimes Workgroup: Chief Kitzerow reported that they are still standing by in getting an agreement for the strike teams. Chief Immler also advised that they should be having their final meeting in the next couple weeks.
- XI. Liaison Updates
  - a. Data Sharing: Chief Kitzerow will save his comments for the LEX meeting afterwards. He reminded everyone of the Intel meeting after LEPC.
  - b. Child Abuse Protocol: No report was presented.

- c. Criminal Justice Commission: Vice-Chairman Alexander reported that on Monday the CJC had a business and Annual Planning Meeting. During the business meeting, the Executive Director mentioned the success of the Citizen's Criminal Justice Academy. They are looking to expand that program as time goes on. The commission voted on supporting uniform predator and offender residency restriction that will be consistent with the state's standards. During the planning meeting, the overall objectives and priorities were covered for the coming year. Priorities are reentry, LEX, drug court treatment, youth program evaluation, and also crime prevention.
- d. Criminal Justice Institute: Director Schroeder announced that their initial moving date was delayed. Information was sent out on three new classes: (1) Conducting background investigations revamped by FDLE and just came out December 2012 addresses social media and how to conduct background investigations related to those aspects; (2) Investigating domestic violence homicides 24 hour course coming up in June; deals with basic homicide investigations but specifically looking at domestic violence; (3) Introduction to Criminal Investigation for those that need a little help or to advance their career in criminal investigations.
- e. High-Intensity Drug Trafficking Area: Colonel Jim Stormes advised that HIDTA Director Wagner will be at the LEPC meeting next month. He can answer questions about funding and training.
- f. High School Criminal Justice Academies: No report was presented.
- g. Communications/Interoperability: Chief Robert Mangold as he has previously reported, Harris through the MPSCC has provided a proposal to the City of West Palm Beach for a P25 overlay network. That proposal was reviewed by West Palm's consultant and he provided a report in favor of the proposal to the commission. It was his understanding that the Mayor's office is supportive of that proposal. Hopefully within the next two to three weeks West Palm's commission will meet and vote in favor.
