- V. Approval of the minutes of the meeting of May 28, 2015
- VI. Chairman's Comments

- a. Welcomed Captain Rodney Tilley of the Division of Alcoholic Beverages & Tobacco.
- b. Congratulated Colonel Stormes today will be his last day with Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office. He will be assuming an Assistant Chief position at Palm Beach Gardens Police Department. Colonel Frank DeMario will be his replacement at the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office.
- c. Congratulated Chief Investigator Mike Waites on his retirement this week from the State Attorney's Office.
- VII. Initiative/Updates
 - a. Mobile Crisis Unit Dr. Helen Dickey, Supervisor of the Jerome Golden Center for Behavioral Health in West Palm Beach, presented an overview of their unit. They serve north of Southern Boulevard to the Martin County line, and the Glades. Their services are free and they cater to all ages, with or without insurance, and are available 24 hours a day (even on weekends and holidays). They provide assessments, ongoing support and follow-ups, and link people with services. They also support law enforcement at crisis scenes. Chairman Blouin asked the number of calls and staffing level for the center. Dr. Dickey advised that they get around 2,000 calls per year; they have 8 regular staff, including herself and 7-8 per diem staff who work on an as need basis. Their goal is not to "Baker Act" but to think out-of-the-box. Chairman Blouin mentioned their brochure and Dr. Dickey encouraged everyone to call their unit any time.
 - b. Property Fraud Alert Service Michele Nelson, Legal Records and Operations Systems Director, Clerk & Comptroller Palm Beach County provided an overview of the program. According to the FBI, property and mortgage fraud is the fastest growing white collar crime in the U.S. Generally, these schemes involve reporting fraudulent deeds and mortgages which are used to get money from properties other people own. Ms. Nelson explained how these schemes work and discussed the steps they are taking to prevent them from happening. The program is free; it monitors all recorded documents; and an alert is sent to subscribers within 48 hours if a match of their name is found. They launched the program on June 8th of this year, and so far they already have 2,700 registrations. To subscribe, you may register online at their website, or call a toll-free number. Subscribers may choose to receive an alert by email or phone call.
 - c. USCIS T & U Visa Training Immigration Officer Arcadio A. Reyes, U.S. Department of Homeland Security, provided information about USCIS and announced the T & U Visa Training. The program allows victims of crime who have illegal immigrant status to cooperate with law enforcement as well

as receive benefits from the Department of Homeland Security. The intent of the program is to assist the law enforcement community, and provide humanitarian relief to victims of crime. Officer Reyes provided fliers for the training.

- X. Liaison Updates
 - a. Data Sharing: Chief Kitzerow reported that they are continuing to add contributors to the LEX system. Progress of adding Ocean Ridge and Tequesta has slowed down a bit due to CJNET issues. They are in the planning phases for Palm Beach Shores and Lake Clarke Shores. LEX 3.0 training has begun for Jupiter, Lantana, Tequesta, Ocean Ridge, PBSO Detectives, Boynton Beach, Juno Beach and Delray. He thanked the staff for moving the project ahead.
 - b. Recruitment and Retention Committee: Chairman Blouin announced that each agency will be receiving a quarterly staffing survey in the next week or so.
 - c. Criminal Justice Institute: Director Schroeder reported that their trust fund fiscal year ends next Wednesday. They are now in the midst of their final three courses for the year. They will only be returning \$12.14 to the state from the \$235,000 they received. Law Enforcement class 178 graduates next Thursday night, July 2nd at 7:00, Duncan Theater on Lake Worth Campus. Last week they graduated their 4th auxiliary class. Their next Class 181 will begin on August 24th.
 - d. Communications/Interoperability: No report presented.
