#### VII. Presentations

a. Implementation of the PBSO Web-Based DNA Request Form: *Julie Sikorsky, Forensic Biology Unit Manager* 

Ms. Sikorsky talked about the updated PBSO Web-Based DNA Request Form which will be used to track all requests for DNA analysis. The new and improved system is accessible by logging on a website wherein an authorized user from any agency may enter the information regarding requests. Each agency has an administrator who coordinates with the PBSO Evidence Coordinator in order to add authorized users. Ms. Sikorsky provided packets containing tutorials on how to add users and how to navigate the site, and also gave a detailed step-by-step slide presentation of the entire DNA analysis request process. The site was tested by two PBSO detectives and is active as of today.

#### VIII. New Business

a. Chief Assistant Brian Fernandes of the State Attorney's Office discussed the Community Based Prosecution Initiative for the SAO intake unit, wherein a single intake prosecutor is assigned to a particular region. He provided a

handout which included a map showing the four regions for the different agencies, represented by the following prosecutors: Jacqui Charbonneau (North), Greg Kridos (North Central), Lindsay Warner (South Central), and Elizabeth Neto (South). The four regions overlap with the LEX regions.

- b. Chief Assistant Al Johnson of the State Attorney's Office provided information concerning U-visa requests that enable the victim, guardian of a minor victim, or the victim's next of kin to apply for status within the country if they cooperate in ongoing prosecution. There is an existing protocol with PBSO that may be used to develop a similar protocol countywide. Mr. Johnson asked for input and that agencies contact Sherri Collins for any questions or information.
- c. Chief Kitzerow and Vice-Chairman Alexander acknowledged State Attorney Dave Aronberg and Chief Assistant Brian Fernandes concerning the community-based prosecution initiative for adding the prosecution and conviction piece to the long-term LEX vision of countywide information sharing leading to arrests and greater public safety.

## XI. Liaison Updates

- a. Data Sharing: Chief Kitzerow again acknowledged the efforts of Denise Vidal-Bennett and Penny Anderson. He provided an update about the Finder integration system is moving along; Phase I of the project is about 95% complete in Boca Raton, to about 40% complete in Jupiter. Bulk system is moving along as well and the Board of Directors will be moving and their contract will be executed between LEX and the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC). Chief Kitzerow thanked the CJC for their support.
- b. Child Abuse Protocol: Chief Scheller reminded that the next Child Abuse Specialists meeting will be on October 11<sup>th</sup>. He will provide a reminder and exact details at the next meeting.

- c. Criminal Justice Commission: Vice-Chairman Alexander announced that the full commission will meet on September 9<sup>th</sup> at 8:00 am.
- d. Criminal Justice Institute: Director Schroeder reported that one class is graduating on September 19th and another on October 24th. Two part-time corrections academies are running right now. They will be starting a full-time corrections academy in October. The Equivalency training classes will start on October 15th. The fourth class of the Dispatch academy begins on Monday. They hope to offer the at the State Officers' Certification Exam at the College.
- e. High-Intensity Drug Trafficking Area: Colonel Stormes mentioned that Director Tim Wagner is making an effort to have as much training locally as possible. An Undercover Operations training class will be held on September 24<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> at the PBSO Training Center. Training includes supervisors, officers, federal agencies, and analysts. They also recently had training in July at the West Palm Beach Police Department.
