IV. Approval and/or additions to the agenda

The October 24, 2013 agenda was approved with one addition from Chief Jenkins.

V. Approval of the minutes of the meeting of September 26, 2013

The minutes of the September 26, 2013 meeting was approved.

- VI. Chairman's Comments
 - a. Congratulated Chief Roger Crane of the South Palm Beach Police Department on his retirement. He has been with the department for 28 years; 20 years of which as Chief. Chairman Stepp also presented Chief Crane a plaque in appreciation of his dedicated and outstanding service to the LEPC. Chief Crane thanked the members of the LEPC and the Chief's Association for the camaraderie through the years.
 - b. Congratulated Chief John Pruitt of Jupiter Inlet Colony Police Department on his appointment.
 - c. The committee voted to cancel the November meeting as it was too close to the October meeting date, and meet in December when elections will also be held. Reminded everyone that the December 12th meeting will be held at the West Palm Beach Police Department.
- VII. Presentations
 - a. DNA Direct Initiative: One Year Later *Dr. Cecelia A. Crouse, Crime Laboratory Director of the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office*

Dr. Crouse provided an update on the initiative. She explained the reasons for the initiative and the relationship between property and violent crimes. She discussed a 3-year collaborative study between New York City, Miami-Dade, and Palm Beach County that clearly showed that stopping individuals at the property crime level affects the numbers of violent crime which makes property crime investigations very important. However, since most property crimes do not have a suspect, DNA collection is very labor intensive. So they developed a more efficient system which involves outsourcing PBC property crime DNA samples. Chairman Stepp thanked Dr. Crouse for their good work.

- VIII. New Business
 - a. Chief Richard Jenkins was contacted by Jeff Kadel Director of the Palm Beach County Substance Abuse Awareness Coalition about the Great Debate that

will be held at the Duncan Theatre at Palm Beach State College on October 30th at 6:30 pm. The debate is concerning the potential legalization of marijuana during the upcoming legislative year. He encouraged all agencies to send a representative and said Katherine Hatos will email the details to everyone.

b. Baker Act: Michael Rodriguez, Executive Director of the Criminal Justice Commission

Michael Rodriguez wanted to know if the committee would like to change the MOU concerning law enforcement transport for Baker Act facilities signed in 2009 to add JFK and another hospital that have recently become receiving facilities. Captain Kenny remarked that the MOU basically says that everyone is required to follow the state statute. But he wanted to know whether the MOU should be followed every year, or only for that legislative year, and if it is the latter, he suggested not doing it. Chief Crane commented that JFK has been receiving Baker Act individuals almost on a daily basis so he wondered why they wanted to be part of the MOU. Captain Kenny said that he got the call from JFK and that they have a new director who has become aware of the MOU. After some further discussion, Chairman Stepp suggested and everyone agreed that CJC staff will research the best way to resolve the issue.

- X. Committee/Workgroup Reports
 - a. Book and Release Committee: Chief Crane recommended that the CJC continue to have a representative from the State Attorney's Office on the committee, and thanked Mr. Brian Fernandes for his input, because their presence has a significant impact on the discussions especially with their extensive knowledge of the state statutes. Chairman Stepp asked for volunteers to replace Chief Crane.
 - b. Recruitment and Retention Committee: Ms. Hatos will send the report by email.
 - c. Traffic Committee: Chief Crane shared his experience as a member of the committee. He thinks the committee needs to continue. He noted that they have received cooperation from the court system, and thanked Louis Tomeo for his help and all the information they obtained from the Clerk's Office. He offered some suggestions on how to improve the committee, and suggested that the next LEPC representative have a good rapport with the Chief Judge and a good handle of the inner workings of the court.

- d. Sexual Assault Response Team: Chief Hartmann will be stepping down from the team. Chairman Stepp thanked Chief Jenkins for volunteering for the position.
- e. Court Systems Task Force: No report was presented.
- XI. Liaison Updates
 - a. Data Sharing: Chief Kitzerow advised that they are still moving ahead with the LEX Finder contractor. After the meeting with the Sheriff, they will have a LEX briefing, at the conclusion of which will be a briefing with John Large about the FPL power grid and the security there. He encouraged everyone to stay for the briefing.
 - b. Child Abuse Protocol: No report was presented.
 - c. Criminal Justice Commission: No report was presented.
 - d. Criminal Justice Institute: Director Schroeder reported that 34 recruits graduated last Thursday night, and they are starting a new class on Monday. The CJSTC will meet on November 4th in Destin. The biggest issue on the agenda is the reworking of the curriculum for the law enforcement basic recruit class. He will report back at the next meeting.
 - e. High-Intensity Drug Trafficking Area: Colonel Stormes mentioned that Captain Coleman is sending out a notice about a new class and encouraged everyone to attend.
 - f. High School Criminal Justice Academies: No report was presented.
 - g. Communications/Interoperability: Chairman Stepp mentioned that the MPSCC is meeting with Mayor Muoio next week.
