IV. Approval and/or additions to the agenda

The December 12, 2013 agenda was approved.

V. Approval of the minutes of the meeting of October 24, 2013

The minutes of the October 24, 2013 meeting was approved.

- VI. Chairman's Comments
 - a. Welcomed Interim Chief Carl Webb of the South Palm Beach Police Department and Resident Agent in Charge Robert Pearce of the U.S. Secret Service.
- VII. Presentations
 - a. Palm Beach County Youth Court Services: *Major Braxton "BK" Davis, Palm Beach School District Police Department*

Major Davis gave a presentation on the updates to the Youth Court Juvenile First Offender (JFO) program. He provided a historical background on the program in Palm Beach County. In addition, he discussed the services in relation to the Civil Citation program under the state. He remarked that the Civil Citation program would be good in counties that do not have a JFO program; but Palm Beach County's program has been around for a long time. He recommended continuing the program especially considering the program enhancements which include: 1) having all agencies in the county participating with at least one JFO officer; 2) improved computer system that will be up in January plugged into the JAC, State Attorney's Office, and School Police dispatch center so every officer will have access to the system 24/7 creating a safety net; 3) training for new JFO officers; and 4) providing services to any agencies that don't have JFO programs.

There was a lengthy and extensive discussion on the merits of continuing the JFO program as opposed to adopting the civil citation program proposed by the state. The committee voted unanimously to support the JFO program as presented with the enhancements, and to establish a committee to be chaired by Major Davis to monitor the progress of the program and report back to LEPC.

b. Anti-Stalking Collaborative Update: *Kristin Cantrell, Attorney for the Legal Aid Society of Palm Beach County*

Kristin Cantrell announced upcoming training in January which is National Stalking Awareness Month. The meeting will be held on January 23rd at the

Boca Raton Police and Fire Training Complex. The training includes 2 tracks; one for law enforcement, and another for advocates and service providers. The training is free, but may be their last training as the grant is coming to an end. Ms. Cantrell strongly encouraged everyone to attend. She provided information about the nomination form for Outstanding Stalking Victim Service Provider which will be awarded in the morning of the training. There are three categories which are advocacy, legal, and law enforcement.

Ms. Cantrell mentioned the tool kit which they distributed earlier in the year. Anyone interested can request a copy. She also announced their upcoming meetings every second Thursday of the month at 2:00-4:00 p.m. at the Children's Services Council in Boynton Beach, and their quarterly meetings in March and in June.

VIII. New Business

a. Election of Officers

Chairman Stepp explained the normal transition process for the outgoing President of the Palm Beach County Association of Chiefs of Police to move into the Chairman position of the LEPC and the new incoming President serves as Vice-Chairman. Chief Daniel Alexander was unanimously elected as LEPC Chairman and Director Kirk Blouin as Vice Chairman

b. 2014 Meeting Schedule

Chief Stepp mentioned the 2014 meeting schedule included in the packet. Katherine Hatos noted that there are a couple of dates that the committee will be meeting at the West Palm Beach Police Department's Community Room as indicated on the schedule.

- IX. Old Business: No old business discussed.
- X. Committee/Workgroup Reports
 - a. Book and Release Committee: Currently vacant. The next meeting is on February 5th at noon. Chairman Stepp asked for volunteers for the position. He noted the importance of the committee.
 - b. Recruitment and Retention Committee: Chief Yannuzzi announced that a request will be going out next week to solicit for the current quarter. He remarked that this quarter is important in terms of the fiscal year and what activities took place in the budget process.
 - c. Traffic Committee: Chairman Stepp asked for volunteers for the vacant position.

- d. Sexual Assault Response Team: Chief Jenkins reported that the countywide workgroup made a recommendation to increase individual officer training on sexual assault to 20 hours per officer at the last meeting. He expressed a concern and noted they will look at trying to lower the hours or use other avenues such as TrainYou.
- e. Court Systems Task Force: No report was presented.
- XI. Liaison Updates
 - a. Data Sharing: Chief Kitzerow reminded everyone that there will be no LEX meeting after the LEPC meeting. Penny Anderson reported that they are integrating Jupiter's data into the system next. Juno Beach is QAing their data before integrating into LEX and making it searchable through LEX and FINDER. West Palm Beach will be next.
 - b. Child Abuse Protocol: Chief Scheller reported that on November 19th the oversight committee met with the State Attorney's Office with the overall consensus that they are not going to be required to go back to the grand jury. They are going to be making some updates and changes to the protocol and meet again on the second week of January regarding the proposed changes. Once the final draft is completed it will be sent out to the Chiefs for review.
 - c. Criminal Justice Commission: No report was presented. Mike Rodriguez announced the upcoming CJC Annual Planning meeting in February.
 - d. Criminal Justice Institute: Director Schroeder reported on two Corrections Academy graduations and noted that next Tuesday night will be graduation for their 911 dispatcher course. The next Law Enforcement Academy starts on January 27th. They have three in progress right now, with the first graduation in February. Also, the next part-time Law Enforcement Academy starts on February 3rd and they are running two 911 dispatcher courses beginning in January. Director Schroeder encouraged everyone to look at the 911 dispatcher course since it is taking off. He noted that they are maintaining their advanced specialized training keeping within the confines of \$40 per officer, as compared to \$67 per officer. He thanked the Chiefs' Association and others as it looks like in July their funding will be returned to \$67 per officer with a proposal which includes an incremental increase annually.
 - e. High-Intensity Drug Trafficking Area: Colonel Stormes mentioned that Captain Coleman will be distributing a couple more flyers. He encouraged everyone to send their officers to the classes. They are free and provided by HIDTA.
 - f. High School Criminal Justice Academies: No report was presented.

- g. Communications/Interoperability: Chairman Stepp reported that Chief Mangold along with a few members of the MPSCC are meeting this morning with some West Palm Beach city officials to discuss their continuation in the radio program.
- XII. Training Announcements

- XIII. Member Comments: On behalf of the entire LEPC, Vice Chairman Alexander thanked Chairman Stepp for stepping in when Chief Kelly retired and presented him with a plaque for outstanding and dedicated service to the LEPC. Chairman Stepp thanked everyone.
