#### **Meeting Minutes**

**I. Welcome and Introductions**: Mr. Tate called the meeting to order at 10:07 a.m. Mr. Tate Thanked all who volunteered and participated in the Back To School Bash held on Saturday August 6<sup>th</sup>. He then asked all those in attendance today to introduce themselves.

#### II. Presentation-Mr. Todd Bonlarron, Assistant County Administrator Palm Beach County

After an introduction County Administrator Bonlarron discussed several issues related to County business provided and provided an overview of County affairs and business which was followed by a Question and Answer portion. The following comments by the ACA reflect this portion of his presentation.

- If the proposed 1% sales tax passes in November, 50% of its revenues will go to PBC schools, 30% to the PBC, and 20% to municipalities.
- PBC officials are informing residents of the impact of the sales tax, however, officials are also taking care not to support or oppose the tax. The final say will be with PBC voters.
- County personnel are planning to provide map and web-based information on where projects slated for redevelopment and revitalization are located in the County.
- Approximately \$24 million is slated in overall state funding to combat the Zika virus, roughly \$500,000 over the next few months will flow to PBC.
- Florida Dept. of Health is embarking on a Drain and Cover Up program to inform residents on how to safeguard against Zika concerns.
- The Glades area of PBC has been a top priority for PBC elected and appointed officials and infrastructure projects existing and planned for the area is a reflection of this.
- An estimated \$25 million in funding for roads-relating projects will be provided to the Glades area over the next five years.
- The issues of homelessness as well as mental health are of great concerns to residents and officials and efforts continue to find ways to effectively address both.
- There will be more resources provided to these issues with passage of the tax levy.

#### III. Presentation-Ms. Heidi Nielsen & Mr. Paul Bates, Peggy Adams Animal Rescue League

After being introduced, representatives from Peggy Adams informed attendees of their work. The League has been in existence for 91 years. It offers vaccines, clinics, foster programs, cats for adoption, spay/neuter programs, and food pantry programs.

They have embarked on a strategy addressing the overpopulation of feral cats. They are open to working with individuals and organizations that share these concerns.
