**I. Welcome and Introductions**: Houston Tate, OCR Director called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m. and asked the group to introduce themselves.

# II. Presentation – Carlos Serrano, Director of Strategic Planning & Operations, Palm Beach County Dept. of Economic Sustainability.

Mr. Tate introduced Mr. Serrano. # Marvin Hubert, PBC Fire Rescue, reported the following:

• In 2015, Fire Rescue assisted in providing and installing 512 smoke alarms in the Glades area. Other communities, such as San Castle and Plantation will be provided alarms in 2017. The alarms are 10 year battery operated Lithium detectors.

# Ken Wilson, PBC Dept. of Health representative, reported the following:

• The Zika virus is still a concern and a danger to South Florida residents. Please be mindful and do not allow standing water areas to accumulate.

#### Wesley White, Dept. of Animal Control representative, reported the following:

 As a friendly reminder, please do you part to control the animal and pet population by neutering and spaying your pet dog or cat.

#### David Rafaidus, Dept. of Community Services representative, reported the following:

The DCS is currently working on updating the Community Health Improvement Plan. The plan will
