1	1	Cabana Colony Residents League, Inc.	Community Events and Traffic Calming Project -The project entails: 1) the purchase of various items to support community events. The requested items include event signage, corrugated plastic materials, "A" frame signs, an outdoor projector screen, collapsible wagons, storage bins, and SMS notification service for resident event communication (\$1,890), and 2) the purchase and installation of portable traffic calming devices. The requested items include removable rumble strips, "children at play" signs and cutouts, and "slow down" signs (\$1,485).	\$3,375.00
2	2	Robert King an individual representing Cam Estates	Solar-Powered Street Lighting Project - The project entails the procurement of professional services for the installation of solar street lighting at 1096 and 1100 Cameo Circle in West Palm Beach. The lighting will illuminate the west side of Brian Way, enhancing public safety and helping to deter criminal activity in the community. The requested services include professional installation of solar-powered streetlights.	\$10,000.00
3	2	Community Faith Outreach Ministries, Inc.	Solar-Powered lights, Address signs, Community Garden and Emergency Preparedness Projects -The overall project entails: 1)the purchase of solar lights and address signs to be installed next to neighborhood association mailboxes. The purpose is to illuminate streets, enhance safety for all residents, and deter criminal activity. The requested items include solar-powered address signs and lighting. (\$10,000), 2) Tthe purchase of items to extend and expand the Intergenerational Garden, providing more residents with the opportunity to learn about naturally food cultivation. The requested items include garden supplies, small trees, shade tents for garden beds, pavers, paint for bench restoration, fencing, tables, chairs, perimeter fencing, steel fence posts, and other necessary materials. (\$10,000), and 3) the purchase of emergency preparedness kits for distribution to residents of Lantana Homes. The requested items include emergency camping survival kits (\$10,000).	\$30,000.00
4	5	Country Club Acres Association, Inc.	Solar-Powered Street Lighting, Front Entrance Sign and Landscaping, and Little Free Library and Newsletter Projects -The overall project entails: 1) the procurement of professional services for the purchase and installation of two solar streetlights. The lighting will enhance visibility and safety in the neighborhood. The requested items and services include the purchase of solar streetlight units and procurement of professional installation services (\$10,000), 2) the purchase procurement of professional services for the installation of improvements at key neighborhood entry points. The requested items and services include the purchase of an entrance sign, decorative benches, landscaping materials, and procurement of associated professional installation services (\$10,000), and 3) the purchase and procurement of professional services and materials to support neighborhood community engagement. The requested items and services include the purchase of Little Free Libraries, professional printing services for a quarterly newsletter, and related materials (\$3,000).	\$23,000.00
5	6	Glades Initiative, Inc.	Landscaping and Beautification Project -The project entails the purchase and procurement of professional services and materials to enhance the area used for a community food distribution program. The improvements aim to beautify the site and provide comfortable, functional spaces for residents participating in the program. The requested items include trash receptacles, picnic tables, benches, bike racks, professional landscaping services, outdoor plants, additional landscaping (fill and leveling), and food.	\$10,000.00
6	6	City of South Bay	Playground Shade and Basketball Surface Repainting Project -The overall project entails: 1) the procurement of professional services for the purchase and installation of rectangular hip roof playground shade structures at Cox and Tanner Park. These structures are intended to provide shade and enhance safety and comfort for children (\$10,000), and 2) the procurement of professional services to repaint the basketball courts at both Tanner and Cox Parks. The scope includes all necessary materials and professional painting services (\$5,000).	\$15,000.00
7	6	Federation of Families of Florida, Inc.	Farmers' Market Project - The project entails the purchase and procurement of professional services to support the establishment of a farmers' market in the City of South Bay. The market will provide designated space for small farmers and gardeners, stimulate the local economy, increase resident access to nutritious food, and promote healthy living. The requested items and services include the acquisition and expert installation of a refurbished shipping container and four pavilions.	\$9,500.00
8	2 & 6	Restoration Bridge International, Inc. (RBI)	Food Distribution Equipment and Supplies -The overall project entails: 1) the purchase of electric pallet jacks to support monthly food distribution efforts serving food-insecure households in CCRT areas and the Glades. The equipment will improve efficiency and safety in handling large quantities of food. (\$9,500), and 2) the purchase of essential supplies to support food distribution events in CCRT Areas and the Glades. The requested items include bags, gloves, plastic shrink wrap, box cutters, and safety vests (\$5,000).	\$14,500.00
9	7	Westgate Community Redevelopment Agency, Inc.	Community Orchard Project - The project entails the purchase and procurement of professional services and materials to establish a community orchard in the Westgate neighborhood. The orchard aims to improve resident health, increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables, and provide educational opportunities on growing fruit trees locally. The requested items and services include the professional installation of a well and pumps, sprinklers and irrigation components, soil testing, general supplies, fruit trees, landscape fabric, and staples.	\$9,625.00
