**What do you enjoy most about teaching Visual Arts classes with A4AFL-PBC?**

The artists! Every week they come into class with so much joy and excitement about what we are doing. Even if they are not a fan of a particular stage of a project, like the feeling of paper maché, they still have fun and enjoy the experience. Every week I go home with a full heart because of them.

**You have taught a wide variety of classes for both adults and youth, what is your favorite art class or media to teach and why?**

I love teaching collage. It is such a great way to see each artists' style come through. When the final pieces are hung together, it is just magical. Everyone can be working on the same project and they turn out SO differently.

**What is one of your favorite moments as a teaching artist with A4AFL-PBC?**

There have been so many! One of my favorite moments was from one of my first collage classes. There was a new student who was not sure if she liked her artwork and was doubting herself. When she stood up to present her artwork at the end of the class when we have everyone go around and share their art, several other artists got so excited they practically gasped at what she created. They loved it so much that it made her feel better about her art; you could literally see the uncertainty leave her face. They are genuinely supportive of each other.

**How did you get involved in teaching art for people with disabilities?**

My little brother, Ryan (27) has Down Syndrome so my family and I have been involved in the community for my entire life. My dad was my brother's Special Olympics coach all the way up to his adult years and my husband was a coach here in PBC. I have developed a passion for the special needs community, especially the adult group over the years. We have come a long way with resources and activities for children with disabilities but I think there needs to be more affordable resources for adults.

**Other - If there is something you would like to say or add instead of one of the questions above feel free to do so here:**

Right now I am transitioning my career from Graphic Design over to working with people with disabilities. My dream is to open a community here in Southeast Florida for special needs adults to live. A home that gives them a structured environment where they can thrive in adulthood with a purpose and a sense of community while still being affordable to their families. Which is why I love Arts4All so much, they do that every day with all of their students.

**What do you enjoy the most about teaching Arts4All dance classes?** What I enjoy the most about teaching Arts4All dance classes is that even on my worst day, upon my arrival, it's simply no longer a negative one. Once I see my beautiful, unique, and positive dancers they are there with welcoming arms and by the end of class their pure joy and excitement just puts things into perspective that there is more to celebrate and others have such a beautiful way of reminding us of simply that... finding the joy in life!

**Do you have a dance or cheer background?** I have been involved with dance, cheerleading and gymnastics in one form or another since the age of four. Through the many years of being a performer, I have transitioned to other aspects of my craft. I am a choreographer for the Miss American Coed Pageant system, and also choreographed for local Miss USA, Miss America and Miss Sugar pageants. As a former college cheerleader at the University of Maryland, as well as, a National Cheerleaders Association (NCA) instructor, I have coached cheer at the high school, middle school and college level, along with judged cheerleading throughout the East Coast and across the pond in England.

**How did you get involved in teaching dance for people with disabilities?** My involvement with teaching dance for people with varying abilities simply was when Arts4All reached out to me inquiring if I would be interested. I lucked out having a previous working relationship with Therapeutic Rec during my career as a Recreation Specialist with Palm Beach County.

**What has been your favorite performance?** Hmmm, so far, one of my favorite performances was this past summer, because it was exciting seeing them perform on the big stage with the lights at Duncan. Now that I am heading into my 4th session, I'm looking forward towards being able to choreograph a new routine inspired by my muses, the dancers themselves! They fuel my creative fire!

Joette strives to promote self-esteem, increased awareness, and sensitivity of the Deaf culture and people of all abilities.

Joette worked an entire week at Indian Pines Elementary, and put a play on at the end of the week with the 4th & 5th grade students entitled, "The Recess Queen". The positive message of sharing echoed throughout the halls of the school. She also provided a half-day workshop for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing students at Palm Springs Middle and John I. Leonard High School.

# DANCE, DANCE, DANCE

Our dance residency with Forest Hill Elementary School is one of several school-based performing arts programs held throughout the year. Instructor, Kali DeCarlo meets with seven self-contained Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) units once a week for 30 minutes each. Select students in 5th grade are chosen to perform at the Arts4All Florida-Palm Beach County Showcase in December and always put on a show-stopping performance. This dance residency gives students the opportunity to explore the art of dance and movement and to be a part of the creative process.

This past fall the Forest Hill Elementary students performed at the Showcase entitled "All Shining Stars". Ms. Kali choreographed a dance to go along with the song, "Eye of the Tiger". Every week, students practiced diligently with Ms. Kali and encouraged one another to give their very best effort. Even the students from Bak Middle School of the Arts were excited to be on the stage. Learning about themselves, taking chances, having a growth mindset, trying new things, and having fun are just some of the benefits of the dance residency for our very wonderful and special students.
