

LANDSCAPING GONE WILD

Tips

Landscapers are not regulated in Florida. Here are some ways to avoid difficulties:

- First, do your homework and check the business by asking friends or neighbors for referrals.
- Get several estimates. Sometimes the least expensive estimate is not always the best way to go. Get suggestions on what plants will work with your property.
- Never pay with cash, try to use a check or credit card so there is a record of the transaction. Never fully pay for the job until it is completed satisfactorily.
- If possible, go to the nursery and personally inspect the plants to be purchased. A plant in a 15-gallon container is a lot different than one in a 45-gallon container.
- Get it in writing and insist on a signed contract. Make sure the contract is legible and details the size and type of the plants, costs, and any special conditions of the job. Never rely on a hand shake or verbal agreement.
