## **Tips**

- The Do-It-Yourself Will kits and form packages offer a variety of options, including subscription services, storing documents on a server, or downloading the forms at a minimal cost.
- Most Do-It-Yourself kits include a disclaimer advising that they are not providing legal advice and counsel. Most disclaimers indicate that the company is not responsible for any consequential or punitive damages that arise from the use of their product. Keep this in mind when making your decision.
- Estate planning needs vary from individual to individual. While these packages may give you a place to start, you may also wish to review the document with a legal professional to ensure that the final product will be accepted in your state.
- A debilitating disease or injury may rob you of the ability to make heath care decisions. Florida has advance health care tools such as living wills and health care surrogate designation forms which designate a decision maker.
