Important Notice: Certificate of Competency Preemption - Effective July 1, 2025

The Palm Beach County Construction Industry Licensing Board (CILB) would like to inform you that, effective **July 1, 2025**, specific trades will be preempted in accordance with the following state statutes:

- House Bill 735 (2021) The Florida Senate
- House Bill 1383 (2023) The Florida Senate
- Senate Bill 1142 (2024) The Florida Senate

As a result, Palm Beach County will no longer require a county-issued Certificate of Competency for the trades listed below. However, businesses must still meet specific requirements to operate.

Affected Trades

As of July 1, 2025, a Certificate of Competency will no longer be required for the following trades:

- Acoustical/Suspended Ceiling
- Carpentry Finish
- Countertop
- Decorative Metal
- Dredging and Land Filling
- Fabric Awnings
- Insulation
- Lightning Protection Systems
- Painting
- Paver Brick/Paver Systems

- Paving
- Plastering
- Reinforcing Steel
- Seal Coating/Striping
- Sign Contractor (Non-Electrical)
- Tennis Court
- Tile, Terrazzo, and Stone
- Underground/Overhead Transmission Lines
- Wood Flooring

What's Changing

- 1. The Palm Beach County Contractor Regulations Office will no longer issue Certificates of Competency for the trades listed above.
- 2. These trades will be reclassified in the Contractor Portal as *Installers* (for your specific trade).

What Stays the Same:

- Business Tax Receipt (BTR): Installers must obtain a PBC Business Tax Receipt from the Palm Beach County Tax Collector's Office: https://www.pbctax.gov/taxes/business-tax/
- 2. **New Applications:** The PBC Contractor Regulations Office will continue to process new applications for these trades. Applicants must provide valid Workers Compensation Insurance, Liability Insurance, a Surety Bond, and a current PBC Business Tax Receipt.

3. **Renewals:** *Installers* will still be able to renew annually. The portal will prevent permit issuance if the required documentation is expired.
