Preservation of Existing Vegetation in Plans

Per the Technical Manual, a Regulating Plan or an Alternative Landscape Plan (ALP) shall include the Tree Disposition Chart in which all trees to be preserved, relocated, removed or replaced are identified. All trees that are to be preserved, pursuant to the Disposition Chart, shall be indicated on the Site Plan or Subdivision Plan, whichever is applicable. **The trees shall be identified with a tag number that is cross-referenced in the Disposition Chart, and depicted using a gray color line.**

If the Site Plan or Subdivision Plan is overcrowded with information, it is at the discretion of the Zoning Project Manager to allow **the tree tag identification** information to be shown only on the Regulating Plan while the preserved trees shall still be shown. In that case, a note shall be added to the Site or Subdivision Plan stating "See Regulating Plan for Preserved Vegetation Tree Tag Number Information".

The Zoning Division Technical Manual will be amended as part of the ULDC Round 2021-01 amendment updates to reflect this change.
