AND REPAIR FACILITY AND LOT on Lot 4, Delray Beach Estates, in Section
4, Township 46 South, Range 43 East, as recorded in Plat Book 21, page
13. Said property located on the west side of U.S. Highway No. 1 (S.R.
5), approximately 1/2 mile south of Gulfstream Boulevard in a CG-General
