# RESOLUTION APPROVING ZONING PETITION EAC1973-223(A) DEVELOPMENT ORDER AMENDMENT PETITION OF SOUTHERN BELL TELEPHONE & TELEGRAPH AND BELLSOUTH BY JONATHAN PAULES, AGENT (BELLSOUTH SANDALFOOT)

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as the governing body of Palm Beach County, Florida, pursuant to the authority vested in Chapter 163 and Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, and the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code, is authorized and empowered to consider petitions relating to zoning; and

WHEREAS, the notice and hearing requirements, as provided for in Article 5 of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code, have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, Zoning Petition EAC1 973-223(A) was presented to the Board of County Commissioners at a public hearing conducted on April 26, 2001; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the evidence and testimony presented by the petitioner and other interested parties, and the recommendations of the various county review agencies; and

WHEREAS, this approval is subject to Article 5, Section 5.8 (Compliance with Time Limitations), of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code and other provisions requiring that development commence in a timely manner; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners made the following findings of fact:

- 1. This Development Order Amendment is consistent with the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan.
- 2. This Development Order Amendment complies with the relevant and appropriate portions of Article 6, Supplementary Use Standards; of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code.
- 3. This Development Order Amendment is consistent with the requirements of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code.
- 4. This Development Order Amendment, with conditions as adopted, is compatible as defined in the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code and generally consistent with the uses and character of the land surrounding and in the vicinity of the land proposed for development.
- 5. This Development Order Amendment, with conditions as adopted, complies with the standards imposed on it by applicable provisions of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code for use, layout, function, and general development characteristics.
- 6. This Development Order Amendment meets applicable local land development regulations.
- 7. This Development Order Amendment, with conditions as adopted, minimizes adverse effects, including visual impact and intensity of the proposed use on adjacent lands.

- 8. This Development Order Amendment has a concurrency determination and complies with Article 11 (Adequate Public Facility Standards) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code.
- 9. This Development Order Amendment, with conditions as adopted, minimizes environmental impacts, including but not limited to water, air, stormwater management, wildlife, vegetation, wetlands and the natural functioning of the environment.
- 10. This Development Order Amendment, with conditions as adopted, will result in logical, timely and orderly development patterns.

WHEREAS, Article 5 of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code requires that the action of the Board of County Commissioners be adopted by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Zoning Petition EAC1973-223(A), the petition of Southern Bell Telephone & Telegraph and Bellsouth, by Jonathan Paules, agent, for a Development Order Amendment /Expedited Application Consideration (EAC) to add square footage on a parcel of land legally described in EXHIBIT A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and generally located as shown on a vicinity sketch attached as EXHIBIT B, attached hereto and made a part hereof, was approved on April 26, 2001, subject to the conditions of approval described in EXHIBIT C, attached hereto and made a part hereof.



## CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

NOTE: All previous conditions of approval are shown in BOLD and will be carried forward with this petition unless expressly modified.

#### A. ALL PETITIONS

- All previous conditions of approval applicable to the subject property, as 1. contained in Resolution R-73-81 9 (Petition 73-223) have been consolidated as contained herein. The petitioner shall comply with all previous conditions of approval and deadlines previously established by Section 5.8 of the ULDC and the Board of County Commissioners, unless expressly modified. (ONGOING: MONITORING-Zoning)
- 2. Development of the site is limited to the uses and site design as approved by the Board of County Commissioners. The approved site plan is dated March 29, 2001. All modifications must be approved by the Board of County Commissioners unless the proposed changes are required to meet conditions of approval or are in accordance with the ULDC. (ONGOING: ZONING)

#### B. **BUILDING AND SITE DESIGN**

1. Within thirty (30) days of removing all exotic vegetation from the property the petitioner shall provide a six (6) foot high masonry screen wall installed in the center of the buffer and measured from finished grade. The exterior side of the masonry wall shall be given a finished architectural treatment. All required landscaping shall be installed on the exterior side of the masonry wall. (CO: LANDSCAPE: BLDG.)

#### C. LANDSCAPING - STANDARD

- Fifty percent (50%) of canopy trees required to be planted in the perimeter 1. buffer shall meet the following minimum standards at installation:
  - Tree height: a. fourteen (14) feet;
  - b. Trunk diameter: 3.5 inches measured 4.5 feet above grade;
  - Canopy diameter: seven (7) feet. Diameter shall be determined by C. the average canopy radius at 3 points measured from the trunk to the outermost branch tip. Each radius shall measure at least 3.5 feet in length; and,
  - d. Credit may be given for existing or relocated trees provided they meet current ULDC requirements. (CO: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)
- 2. All palms required to be planted on site by this approval, except on individual residential lots, shall meet the following minimum standards at installation:

twelve (12) feet clear trunk; a. Palm heights:

b. Clusters: staggered heights twelve (12) to eighteen (18) feet; and,

Credit may be given for existing or relocated palms provided they meet

current ULDC requirements. (CO: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)

C.

- 3. A group of three (3) or more palm or pine trees may not supersede the requirement for perimeter canopy tree in that location, unless specified herein. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)
- 4. All canopy trees to be planted within overhead utilities easement shall be consistent with FP&L's tree list suggested in the "Plant the Right Tree in the Right Place" guidelines and pursuant to Section 7.3.E.12.a of the ULDC. (CO: LANDSCAPE Zoning)

# D. <u>LANDSCAPING ALONG SOUTH PROPERTY LINE</u> (GLADES ROAD FRONTAGE)

- 1. Landscaping and buffering along the south property line shall be upgraded to include:
  - a. a minimum twenty (20) foot wide landscape buffer strip. No width reduction or easement encroachment shall be permitted;
  - b. a minimum two (2) to three (3) foot high undulating berm with an average height of two and one half (2.5) feet measured from top of curb.
  - c. one (1) canopy tree planted every thirty (30) feet on center;
  - d. one (1) palm or pine tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the property line with a maximum spacing of sixty (60) feet between clusters; and,
  - e. twenty-four (24) inch high shrub or hedge material spaced no more than twenty four (24) inches on center at installation. All shrubs or hedge material shall be to be maintained at a minimum height of thirty-six (36) inches with **fifty** (50) percent of the material located on the plateau of the berm. (CO: LANDSCAPE)

# E. <u>LANDSCAPING ALONG NORTHEAST AND NORTHWEST PROPERTY LINES</u> (ABUTTING RESIDENTIAL)

- 1. Landscaping and buffering along the north and northwest property lines shall be upgraded to include:
  - a. a minimum twenty (20) foot wide landscape buffer strip; and
  - b. one (1) canopy tree planted every twenty (20) feet on center;
  - c. one (1) palm or pine tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the property line with a maximum spacing of sixty (60) feet between clusters; and,
  - d. twenty-four (24) inch high shrub or hedge material spaced no more than twenty-four (24) inches on center at installation, to be maintained at a minimum height of thirty-six (36) inches.

# F. ENGINEERING

- 1. Prior to the issuance of any building permits the developer shall deed to Palm Beach County the additional right-of-way required to provide for a one hundred twenty(120) foot from the centerline of Boca Raton West Road (S.R. 808), February 21, 2001. (Previously Condition 1 of Resolution R-73-081 9, Petition 73-223) [Note: Completed. The accompanying survey indicates this condition of approval as completed.]
- 2. Condition 2 of Resolution R-73-081 9, Petition 73-223 which currently states:

Permit for the turnout onto Boca Raton West Road (S.R. 808) shall be a temporary permit.

Is hereby deleted. [REASON: access to Glades Road exist]

# G. <u>LANDSCAPING ALONG EAST AND WEST PROPERTY LINE</u> (ABUTTING COMMERCIAL)

- 1. Landscaping and buffering along the east property line shall be upgraded to include:
  - a. a minimum twenty (20) foot wide landscape buffer strip; and
  - b. one (1) canopy tree planted every twenty (20) feet on center;
  - c. one (1) palm or pine tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the property line with a maximum spacing of sixty (60) feet between clusters; and,
  - d. twenty-four (24) inch high shrub or hedge material spaced no more than twenty-four (24) inches on center at installation, to be maintained at a minimum height of thirty-six (36) inches. (CO: LANDSCAPE)

# H. SIGNS

- 1. Identification sign fronting on Glades Road shall be limited as follows:
  - a. Maximum sign height, measured from finished grade to highest point eight (8) feet;
  - b. Maximum sign face area per side sixty (60) square feet;
  - c. Maximum number of signs one (I); and
  - d. Style monument style only. (CO: BLDG)

# I. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>

- In granting this approval, the Board of County Commissioners relied upon the oral and written representations of the petitioner both on the record and as part of the application process. Deviations from or violation of these representations shall cause the approval to be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for review under the compliance condition of this approval. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
- 2. Failure to comply with any of the conditions of approval for the subject property at any time may result in:
  - a. The issuance of a stop work order; the issuance of a cease and desist order; the denial or revocation of a building permit; the denial or revocation of a Certificate of Occupancy; the denial of any other permit, license or approval to any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; the revocation of any other permit, license or approval from any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; revocation of any concurrency; and/or
  - b. The revocation of the Official Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment, and/or any other zoning approval; and/or
  - C. A requirement of the development to conform with the standards of the ULDC at the time of the finding of non-compliance, or the addition or modification of conditions reasonably related to the failure to comply with existing conditions; and/or
  - d. Referral to code enforcement; and/or
  - e. Imposition of entitlement density or intensity.

Staff may be directed by the Executive Director of PZ&B or a majority vote of the Code Enforcement Board to schedule a Status Report before the body which approved the Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment, and/or other zoning

approval, in accordance with the provisions of Section 5.8 of the ULDC, in response to any flagrant violation and/or continued violation of any condition of approval.

Appeals of any departmental administrative actions hereunder may be taken to the Palm Beach County Board of Adjustment or as otherwise provided in the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC), as amended. Appeals of any revocation of an Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment or other actions based on a Board of County Commission decision shall be by petition for writ of certiorari to the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit. (MONITORING)
