RESOLUTION APPROVING RECOMMENDATION OF
STATUS REPORT NO. SR 2000-102
TO REVOKE THE DEVELOPMENT ORDER AMENDMENT APPROVED BY
RESOLUTION NO. R-2002-0610
PETITION NO. 2000-102
THE PETITION OF JOE FEARNLEY TRUSTEE

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as the governing body, pursuant to the authority vested in Chapter 163 and Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, is authorized and empowered to consider petitions relating to zoning; and

WHEREAS, systematic monitoring and review of approved zoning actions help implement the goals and objectives of the Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, the notice and hearing requirements as provided for in Article 2.E. of the Palm Beach County Land Development Code have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 2.E., Status Report SR 2000-102 was presented to the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County at a public hearing conducted on July 22, 2004; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has reviewed Status Report SR 2000-102 and considered testimony, and the recommendations of the various county review agencies; and

WHEREAS, Article 2.E. of the Palm Beach County Land Development Code authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to revoke the Conditional Use "A"; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners made the following findings of fact:

1. Article 2.E. of the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC) requires staff to determine if previously approved development orders are consistent with the ULDC.
2. Article 15 of the ULDC requires development orders to comply with the Countywide Traffic Performance Standards (TPS).
3. Ordinance 2003-013 amended the Palm Beach County Traffic Performance Standards.
4. Since the adoption of Ordinance 2003-013, a new traffic study is required for staff to determine if Resolution No. R-2001-0602 meets the current Traffic Performance Standards.
5. A new traffic study has not been submitted to Palm Beach County.
6. Staff cannot determine if the development order is consistent with the Traffic Performance Standards because a new traffic study has not been submitted.
7. Staff therefore cannot determine if the development order is consistent with the Unified Land Development Code.
8. Article 2.E. only permits the approval of a time extension if a development order is consistent with the ULDC, or can be made consistent by the amendment of conditions of approval.
10. Resolution No. R-2002-0610 amended Resolution No. R-2001-0602 which rezoned the property.
11. With the concurrent approval of the rezoning, Resolution No. R-2002-0610 will no longer apply to this property.

WHEREAS, Section 5.3 of the Land Development Code requires that the action of the Board of County Commissioners be adopted by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that the recommendation of Status Report No. SR 2000-102, to revoke the Development Order Amendment previously granted by the approval of the petition of Joe Fearnley Trustee, Petition No. 2000-102, confirmed by the adoption of Resolution R-2002-0610, which approved a Development Order Amendment/Expedited Application consideration (EAC) to modify/delete conditions of approval, on property legally described in Exhibit "A", and located approximately 1,500 feet south of Forest Boulevard on the west side of Military Trail, in the Multiple Use Planned Development (MUPD) (including self-service storage, truck rental and outside storage) Zoning District, is approved.


Commissioner Masilotti moved for approval of the Resolution.
