OFFICIAL ZONING MAP AMENDMENT  
TO A PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (PDD)  
APPLICATION OF BOYNTON BEACH ASSOC XIX LLP  
BY KILDAY & ASSOCIATES, INC., AGENT  
(LYONS WEST AGR-PUD)

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, as the governing body of Palm Beach County, Florida, pursuant to the authority vested in Chapter 163 and Chapter 125, Florida Statutes, is authorized and empowered to consider petitions relating to zoning; and

WHEREAS, the notice and hearing requirements, as provided for in Article 2 (Development Review Procedures) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code (Ordinance 2003-067), have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, Zoning Application PDD2005-021 was presented to the Board of County Commissioners at a public hearing conducted on September 22, 2005; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the evidence and testimony presented by the petitioner and other interested parties, the recommendations of the various county review agencies, and the recommendation of the Zoning Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has considered the findings in the staff report and the following findings of fact:

1. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) is consistent with the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan;
2. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) is consistent with the requirements of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code;
3. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) with approved conditions is compatible with surrounding uses and zones, as defined in the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code, is generally consistent with existing uses and zones surrounding the subject land, and is the appropriate zoning district for the land;
4. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) with approved conditions does not result in significantly adverse impacts on the natural environment, including but not limited to water, air, stormwater management, wildlife, vegetation, wetlands, and the natural functioning of the environment;
5. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) with approved conditions will result in a logical and orderly development pattern;
6. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) complies with Article 2.F, (Adequate Public Facilities) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code, Ordinance 2003-067; and,
7. This official zoning map amendment (rezoning) with approved conditions is consistent with the requirements of all other applicable local land development regulations.

WHEREAS, Article 2.K.3.b (Action by Board of County Commissioners) of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code requires that the action of the Board of County Commissioners be adopted by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that Zoning Application PDD2005-021, the application of Boynton Beach Associates XIX, LLP, by Kilday & Associates, Inc., agent, for an Official Zoning Map Amendment to a Planned Development District from the Agricultural Reserve Zoning District to the Agricultural Reserve Planned Unit Development District on a parcel of land legally described in EXHIBIT A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, and generally located as indicated on a vicinity sketch attached as EXHIBIT B, attached hereto and made a part hereof, was approved on September 22, 2005, subject to the conditions of approval described in EXHIBIT C, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Commissioner Marcus moved for the approval of the Resolution.

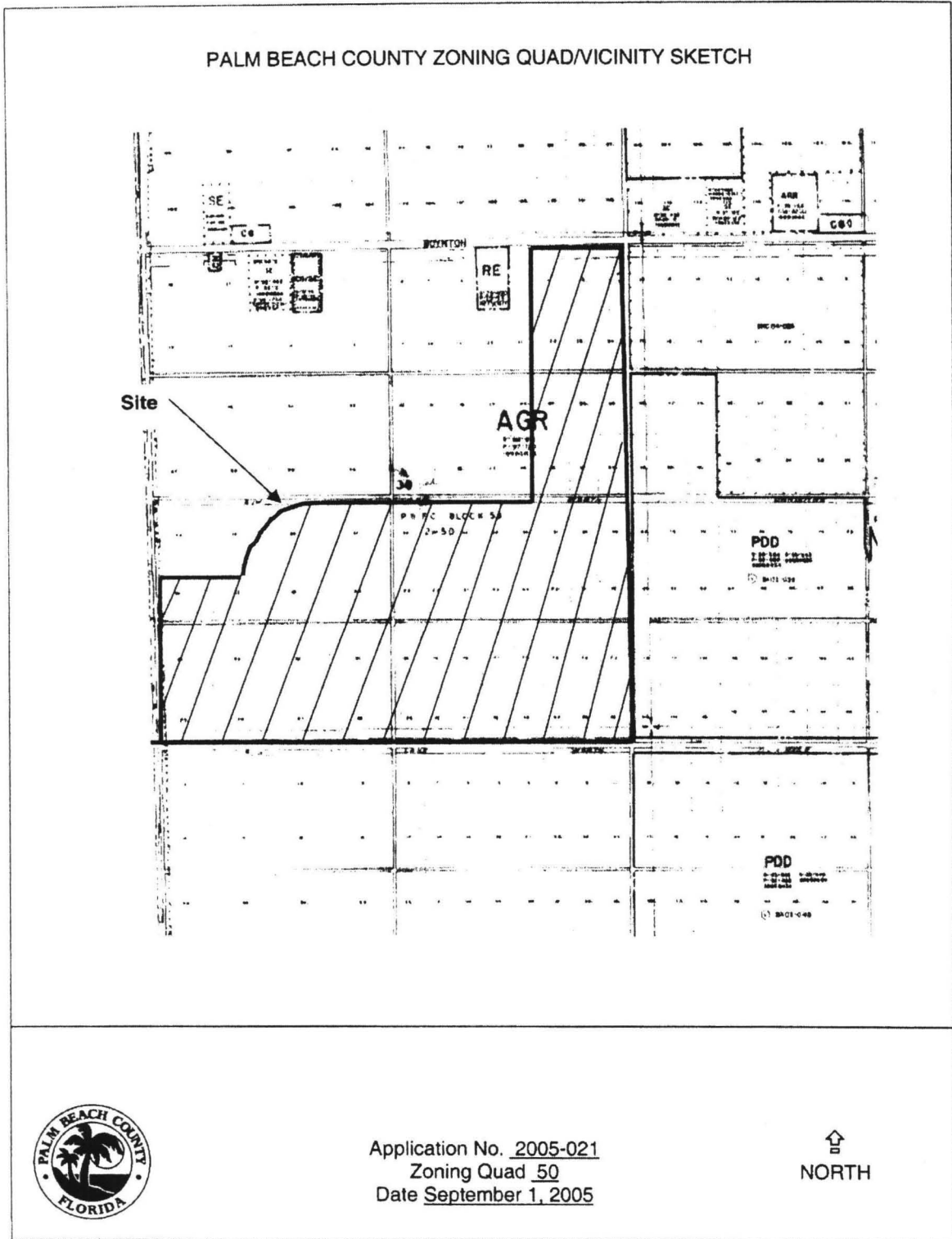

## EXHIBIT C

### CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

#### ALL PETITIONS

1. Development of the site is limited to the site design as approved by the Board of County Commissioners. The approved master plan and regulating plan are dated May 12, 2005. All modifications must be approved by the Board of County Commissioners unless the proposed changes are required to meet conditions of approval or are in accordance with the ULDC. (ONGOING: ZONING - Zoning)

#### BUILDING AND SITE DESIGN

1. All landscape focal points shall be:
  - a. subject to review and approval by the Landscape Section; and,
  - b. reflected on the regulating plan prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO). (DRO: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)
2. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the site/regulating plans shall be revised to indicate a landscape focal point:
  - a. within a central island of all cul-de-sacs;
  - b. in the vicinity of the road frontage of all T-intersection open spaces; and,
  - c. at the terminus of all dead-end streets. (DRO: ZONING - Zoning)
3. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the master/site plans shall be revised to indicate a minimum of one (1) fountain as a focal feature within lake tract 1, 2, 10, 11 and 14. The location of each fountain shall be subject to review and approval by the Zoning Division. (DRO: ZONING - Zoning)
4. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the site plan shall be revised to indicate a minimum eight (8) foot wide band of continuous decorative paving treatment (pre-cast concrete paver blocks or stamped concrete) as follows:
  - a. surrounding a central island within all cul-de-sacs;
  - b. along the perimeter of all semi cul-de-sacs/eyebrows, between the adjacent residential lots only; and,
  - c. this paving shall consist of the same paving material and treatment that is provided at the intersections throughout the site. (DRO: ZONING - Zoning)
5. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the master/site plans shall be revised to indicate a dedicated bike path to and through the 8.4-acre recreation pod. This path:
  - a. shall establish a continuous paved connection between the bike path provided within the 80-foot wide right-of-ways located north and south of the recreation pod;



- b. shall follow an alignment that is acceptable to the Zoning Division, Planning Division, Parks and Recreation Department, Engineering Department and Health Department for the entire duration of this path;
  - c. may be provided in conjunction with a required sidewalk;
  - d. shall be subject to all applicable design and dimensional requirements of ULDC Article 11; and,
  - e. shall be reflected as a typical detail on the Regulating Plan prior to final approval by the DRO. (DRO: ZONING - Zoning)
6. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the site/regulating plans shall be revised to depict upgraded recreation amenities within each of neighborhood park. These additional amenities shall:
- a. be accessible from a minimum five (5) foot wide pathway composed of stamped concrete, paver blocks, or other improved surface. This pathway shall have a direct connection to the the primary sidewalk system on the property;
  - b. include a minimum of two (2) pedestrian benches;
  - c. include a minimum of one (1) trash receptacle adjacent to each pedestrian bench;
  - d. include a shade structure (eg. trellis, gazebo, pergola), tot lot, fitness station, rest station, or similar recreation amenity or other shade structure; and,
  - e. be subject to review and approval by the Architectural Review Section. (DRO: ZONING - Zoning)
7. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the master/site plans shall be revised to indicate an architectural focal point on the 1.02-acre open space tract located to the northeast of Pod E. This architectural focal point shall:
- a. consist of a loggia with decorative columns, berceaux, or fountain;
  - b. be situated upon a mininum 800 square foot surface area composed of paver blocks, stamped concrete, or an alternative surface;
  - c. incorporate a minimum of two (2) pedestrian benches;
  - d. be accessible from a minimum five (5) foot wide pathway composed of stamped concrete, paver blocks, or other improved surface. This pathway shall have a direct connection to the the primary sidewalk system on the property;
  - e. be reflected on the Regulating Plan; and,
  - f. be subject to review and approval by the Architectural Review Section. (DRO: ZONING - Zoning)
8. Prior to final approval of a site plan for the 8.4-acre recreation pod, the Development Review Officer (DRO) shall apply and the property owner shall accept the following condition of approval:
- Prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy (CO) or Certificate of Completion (CC) for the clubhouse, whichever shall first occur, the clubhouse facility shall be equipped with a generator that complies with the following requirements:
- a. operates essential electrical systems, including A/C systems, for a minimum of thirty percent (30%) of the gross interior floor area of the building;

- b. an aboveground fuel storage system, or an alternative fuel storage system that is acceptable to Palm Beach County, with a minimum capacity that is acceptable to the Building Division shall be located adjacent to the generator;
- c. setback in accordance with the Property Development Regulations for a Recreation Pod in accordance with ULDC Table 3.E.2.D-16;
- d. screened from view on all sides by an opaque barrier constructed of compatible materials, color and character as the building or equivalent landscaping;
- e. subject to review and approval by the Building Division; and,
- f. deviation from these requirements shall be permitted if consistent with future ULDC regulations. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING - Zoning)

**ENGINEERING**

**1. TRAFFIC PERFORMANCE STANDARDS PHASING REQUIREMENTS**

In order to comply with the mandatory Traffic Performance Standards, the property owner shall be restricted to the following phasing schedule:

- a. Building Permits for no more than 184 single family dwelling units shall be issued until construction commences on Lyons Road from Lantana Road to Hypoluxo Road as a 4 lane divided section. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING - Eng)
- b. No Building Permits for the site may be issued after January 1, 2010. A time extension for this condition may be approved by the County Engineer based upon an approved Traffic Study which complies with Mandatory Traffic Performance Standards in place at the time of the request. This extension request shall be made pursuant to the requirements of Article 2 Section E of the Unified Land Development Code. (DATE: MONITORING - Eng)

**2. SIGNALIZATION REQUIRMENTS**

The Property Owner shall fund the cost of signal installation if warranted as determined by:

- a) the County Engineer at the Project's Entrance and Lyons Road; and,
- b) the County Engineer and the Florida Department of Transportation at the Project's Entrance and SR 7.

Signalization shall be a mast arm structure installation. The cost of signalization shall also include all design costs and any required utility relocation.

Building Permits for more than 220 dwelling units shall not be issued until the property owner provides acceptable surety in the form of a cash bond or escrow agreement to the Traffic Division in an amount as determined by the Director of the Traffic Division. (BLDG PERMIT:MONITORING - Eng)

- 3. In order to request release of the surety for the traffic signal at these intersections, the property owner shall provide written notice to the Traffic Division stating that the final certificate of occupancy has been issued for this development and requesting that a signal warrant study be conducted at both itersections. The Traffic Division shall have 24 months from receipt of

this notice to either draw upon the monies to construct the traffic signal or release the monies. (ONGOING: ENG - Eng)

4. ROADWAY CONSTRUCTION EASEMENT

Prior to issuance of a building permit, the property owner shall convey a roadway construction easement to Palm Beach County at the Projects Entrance Road and Lyons Road. This roadway construction easement shall contain an isosceles trapezoid connecting the required corner clips across this property owners road right of way for Lyons Road. Construction by the property owner within this easement shall conform to Palm Beach County Standards and Codes. The location, legal sketches and the dedication documents shall be approved by the County Engineer prior to final acceptance. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING - Eng)

5. INTERSECTION IMPROVEMENTS

The property owner shall construct:

- i. right turn lane south approach on State Road 7 at the project entrance;
- ii. left turn lane south approach on Lyons Road at the projects entrance;
- iii. right turn lane north approach on Lyons Road at the project entrance.

This construction shall be concurrent with the paving and drainage improvements for the site. Any and all costs associated with this construction shall be paid by the property owner. These costs shall include, but are not limited to, utility relocations and acquisition of any additional required right-of-way.

- a. Prior to the issuance of the first Building Permit, permits shall be obtained from Palm Beach County for the construction identified in ii and iii, and from the Florida Department of Transportation for construction in i above. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING - Eng)
- b. Construction for the improvements in i-iii shall be completed prior to the issuance of the first Certificate of Occupancy. (CO: MONITORING - Eng)

6. FUTURE SR 7 MEDIAN IMPROVEMENTS

If the Florida Department of Transportation issues revised permits for median improvements on State Road 7 at the project entrance, then a revised DRO Final site plan will be required. During the DRO review intersection improvements will be reviewed and appropriate conditions of approval shall be added/modified to correspond to the revised Department of Transportation Permit. (ONGOING: ENG - Eng)

7. ROAD DRAINAGE EASEMENT

On or before March 1, 2006, the property owner shall convey to Palm Beach County sufficient road drainage easement(s) through the project's internal drainage system, as required by and approved by the County Engineer, to provide legal positive outfall for runoff from those segments of Lyons Road along the property frontage; and up to a maximum of an additional 800 feet of these adjacent roadway(s). The limits of this additional 800 feet of drainage shall be determined by the County Engineer. Said easements shall

be no less than 20 feet in width. Portions of such system not included within roadways or waterways dedicated for drainage purposes will be specifically encumbered by said minimum 20 foot drainage easement from the point of origin, to the point of legal positive outfall. The drainage system within the project shall have sufficient retention/detention, Compensating storage within this projects retention system as required by all permitting agencies, and conveyance capacity to meet the storm water discharge and treatment requirements of Palm Beach County and the applicable Drainage District, as well as the South Florida Water Management District, for the combined runoff from the project to accommodate the ultimate Thoroughfare Plan Road Section(s) of the included segment. If required and approved by the County Engineer the property owner shall construct within the proposed drainage easements a minimum of 24 inch closed piping system and appropriate wingwall or other structures as required by and approved by the County Engineer. Elevation and location of the entire drainage system shall be approved by the County Engineer. Any and all excess fill material from excavation by Palm Beach County within said easements shall become the property of Palm Beach County which at its discretion may use this fill material. (DATE: MONITORING - Eng)

8. LANDSCAPE WITHIN THE MEDIAN OF LYONS ROAD AND STATE ROAD 7

The property owner shall design, install and perpetually maintain the median landscaping within the median of all abutting right of way of Lyons Road and State Road 7. This landscaping and irrigation shall strictly conform to the specifications and standards for the County's Only Trees, Irrigation, and Sod (OTIS) program. Additional landscaping beyond OTIS requires Board of County Commissioners approval. Median landscaping installed by petitioner shall be perpetually maintained by the property owner, his successors and assigns, without recourse to Palm Beach County, unless property owner provides payment for maintenance as set forth in paragraph d below.

- a. The necessary permit(s) for this landscaping and irrigation shall be applied for prior to the issuance of the first 100 building permits. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING - Eng)
- b. All installation of the landscaping and irrigation shall be completed prior to the issuance of the first 150 certificates of occupancy. (CO: MONITORING - Eng)
- c. At the property owner's option, when and if the County is ready to install OTIS on the surrounding medians of this roadway adjacent to the property owner installed landscaping, payment for the maintenance may be provided to the County. The payment shall be in the amount and manner that complies with the schedule for such payments that exists on the date payment is made. Once payment has been provided, Palm Beach County shall assume the maintenance responsibility for the OTIS landscaping and irrigation that has been installed by the property owner. The property owner shall first be required to correct any deficiencies in the landscaping and irrigation. This option is not available to medians with additional landscaping beyond OTIS standards, unless those medians are first brought into conformance with OTIS standards by the property owner. (ONGOING: ENG - Eng)

- d. Also, prior to the issuance of a Building Permit, and at the option of the property owner, the property owner may make a contribution to the County's Only Trees Irrigation and Sod, OTIS program, unincorporated thoroughfare beatification program. This payment, for the County's installation of landscaping and irrigation on qualifying thoroughfares shall be based on the project's front footage along Lyons Road and State Road 7. This payment shall be in the amount and manner that complies with the schedule for such payments as it currently exists or as it may from time to time be amended. (ONGOING: ENG - Eng)

9. SR 7 NOISE MITIGATION

- a. The Master Plan for this site shall be amended to reflect noise mitigation requirements for dwelling units adjacent to SR 7 as outlined in the applicants approved Noise Analysis. Requirements such as a sound wall and or landscape buffers shall be shown on the Master Plan for this site subject to the approval of the County Engineer and Zoning Division. (DRO: ZONING/ENG - Eng)
- b. Construction of any required sound walls and landscape buffers as outlined in the Noise Analysis shall be completed prior to the issuance of the first certificate of occupancy for any lot within Pods A or B. The property owner shall provide Land Development a listing of the applicable PCN numbers for all lots within Pod A and B prior to receipt of the first building permit within Pods A or B. (CO:MONITORING - Eng)
- c. The property owner shall notify future home buyers by providing that all homeowners documents, sales contracts, as well as all sales brochures, Master Plans and related Site Plans contain a disclosure statement identifying that:
  - (i) this site is adjacent to SR7,
  - (ii) the proposed dwelling units are in an area subject to noise generated by traffic as a result of its location to SR7, and
  - (iii) the developer has installed noise abatement improvements determined by the Florida Department of Transportation to be effective in keeping noise levels from SR7 below the State noise abatement criteria in effect as of the date of issuance of this Development Order. All sales contracts and homeowner documents shall also include a statement that any additional noise mitigation measures requested in the future by the Residents will not be funded or constructed by Palm Beach County. (ONGOING: ENG - Eng)
- d. The property owner shall submit documentation of compliance with "c" above on an annual basis to the Monitoring Section of Planning, Zoning and the Building Department. The next report shall be submitted on or before December 15, 2006 and shall continue on an annual basis until all units within the development have been sold or the developer relinquishes control to the homeowner's association. (DATE: MONITORING - Eng)

## ENVIRONMENTAL

1. An Exotic Removal Management Plan, covering all of the conservation parcels, shall be approved by ERM prior to final DRO site plan approval. (DRO: ERM - ERM)
2. All Restricted Covenant Agreements and Conservation Easements for all of the Conservation Parcels, shall be submitted to ERM for review and approval prior to recordation. (PLAT: ERM - ERM)

## HEALTH

1. The property owner shall utilize Best Management Practices (BMP) approved by the Palm Beach County Mosquito Control Division to minimize breeding of mosquitoes in the surface water management system. The BMP shall be incorporated into the governing documents of the Homeowners Association, and shall include mosquito control methods that minimize the need for aerial spraying and reduce potential impacts of mosquito control activities on natural areas. (ONGOING: HEALTH - Health)
2. Prior to the issuance of the first building permit, the property owner shall submit a detailed written plan acceptable to the Palm Beach County Health Department for the control of fugitive dust particulates on the site during all phases of site development. The property owner or the representative of the property owner shall be available to meet with staff of the Air Pollution Control Section of the Palm Beach County Health Department on request to clarify and discuss the scope and potential effectiveness of the proposed dust control measures. (BLDG PERMIT: MONITORING - Health)

## ZONING - LANDSCAPING-STANDARD

1. A minimum of fifty (50) percent of all trees to be planted in the perimeter landscape buffers shall meet the following minimum standards at installation:
  - a. tree height: Fourteen (14) feet;
  - b. trunk diameter: Three and one-half (3.5) inches measured at four and one-half (4.5) feet above grade;
  - c. canopy diameter: Seven (7) feet diameter shall be determined by the average canopy radius measured at three (3) points from the trunk to the outermost branch tip. Each radius shall measure a minimum of three and one-half (3.5) feet in length; and,
  - d. credit may be given for existing or relocated trees provided they meet ULDC requirements. (BLDG PERMIT: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)
2. All palms required to be planted on the property by this approval, except on individual residential lots, shall meet the following minimum standards at installation:
  - a. palm heights: twelve (12) feet clear trunk;
  - b. clusters: staggered heights twelve (12) to eighteen (18) feet; and,
  - c. credit may be given for existing or relocated palms provided they meet current ULDC requirements. (BLDG PERMIT: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)

3. A group of three (3) or more palms may not supersede the requirement for a canopy tree in that location, unless specified herein. (BLDG PERMIT: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)
4. Field adjustment of wall, fence, berm, and plant material locations may be permitted to provide pedestrian sidewalks/bike paths and to accommodate transverse utility or drainage easements crossings and existing vegetation. (BLDG PERMIT: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)
5. Prior to the issuance of a building permit, the property owner shall submit a Landscape Plan to the Landscape Section for review and approval. The Plan(s) shall be prepared in compliance with the conditions of approval as contained herein. (BLDG PERMIT: BLDG - Zoning)

#### ZONING - LANDSCAPING-PERIMETER OF DEVELOPMENT AREA

1. In addition to code requirements, all perimeter landscape buffers shall be upgraded to include:
  - a. a minimum of one (1) native palm for each twenty (20) linear feet of the applicable property line with a maximum spacing of sixty (60) feet between clusters. Palms shall be planted alternating on both sides of a wall or fence;
  - b. a minimum of one (1) pine tree for each thirty (30) linear feet of the applicable property line. Pines shall be planted in clusters of a minimum of five (5), with a maximum spacing of one hundred and fifty (150) feet between clusters. Pines clusters shall be planted alternating on both sides of a wall or fence; and,
  - c. relocation of the above plant materials only shall be permitted only for the landscape buffer abutting the Rural Parkway, subject to review and approval by the Landscape Section. (BLDG PERMIT: LANDSCAPE - Zoning)

#### PLANNING

1. The PUD shall be limited to a maximum of 943 dwelling units and shall meet 60/40 AGR-PUD requirements. (DRO: PLANNING - Planning)
2. Prior to recordation of a plat for the Lyons West Development Area, the property owner is responsible for the recordation of boundary plats for all of the preserve parcels and shall include on said boundary plats, language limiting these parcels to Agricultural Reserve preservation uses as permitted by conditions in this Resolution, the Comprehensive Plan Objective 1.5, and Policies of the Future Land Use Element. (PLAT: PLANNING/ENG - Planning)
3. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the property owner shall provide an as built Rural Parkway Landscape Plan for the entire Lyons West AGR-PUD Rural Parkway Preserve easement. (DRO: PLANNING - Planning)
4. Prior to final Master Plan approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the property owner shall provide an "AGR/PUD Preserve and Development Parcel Location Map" as an addendum to the Master Plan. This addendum shall also indicate the location, access, acreage, and permitted uses within the preservation areas consistent with the Palm Beach

County Comprehensive Plan and the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC). (DRO: PLANNING - Planning)

5. Prior to final Master Plan approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), a management plan for all of the preservation areas shall be submitted. The property owner shall also submit a commitment letter indicating that these preservation properties will remain in their same state from the time of development approval to the final recordation of the conservation easement, or in the event of a change in use, that the new use of the property is consistent with the permitted uses within the preservation areas consistent with the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Plan and Unified Land Development Code (ULDC). The management plan shall contain a legal description and sketch of each parcel, an inventory of existing uses and environmental assets on each site, and a plan approved and enforced by the Department of Environmental Resources (ERM) for exotic removal and maintenance on each of the sites. (DRO: PLANNING/ERM - Planning)
6. Prior to final plan approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the property owner shall add a "Preservation Area/Proposed Uses" notes section on page 1 of the Master Plan and include the following:
  - a. The preservation areas approved as part of Application # 2005-021 shall be restricted to preservation uses as follows, with the exception of areas designated as environmentally sensitive in the conservation easement:

**PERMITTED USES:**

- 1) Crop production, pasture, or equestrian purposes or may be retained as fallow land;
- 2) Accessory structures such as barns and pump structures are permitted;
- 3) Regional water storage areas to serve as water management functions or to serve as a Water Preserve Area if designated by the South Florida Water Management District: to serve regional water management purposes as certified by either Lake Worth Drainage District or South Florida Water management District, or for water management purposes not directly related to the 60/40 AgR-PDD if approved by the Department of Environmental Resources Management and managed for environmental resource values;
- 4) Wetland or bona fide agricultural uses per the ULDC;
- 5) Other uses as permitted by the required conservation easements;
- 6) Other uses as may be permitted within the protected area of an AGR-PDD consistent with the Comprehensive Plan and the Unified Land Development Code,

**NOT PERMITTED:**

- 7) Agricultural support uses such as processing facilities, farmworker housing and the like shall not be accommodated in the protected or preservation area of the AGR-PUD; nor shall new residential uses, other than security/caretakers quarters and groom squarters, be accommodated thereon.



- 8) No residential units or farm residences (whether existing or proposed) shall be allowed within the preserve area. (DRO/ONGOING: PLANNING - Planning)
7. Prior to plat recordation for the Lyons West AGR-PUD development area, the conservation easements for all of the Preservation parcels shall be recorded, as approved by the County Attorney's Office, the Department of Environmental Resources Management, and the Planning Division.
    - a. The conservation easements for all of these preserve parcels shall contain:
      - 1) a legal description, site location, including the address of the parcel and a sketch including the area subject to the easement depicting reference points such as main streets and showing the location of the preserve within the context of the Ag Reserve;
      - 2) a list of permitted uses, uses not permitted, and prohibited activities.
    - b. Title insurance for these easements shall be provided to Palm Beach County subject to approval by the County Attorney and in an amount acceptable to the Department of Environmental Resources Management and the Planning Division. (PLAT: ENG/CTY ATTY/ERM/PLANNING - Planning)
  8. Prior to plat recordation for the Lyons West Development area, the conservation easement for the 100' Lyons Road Rural Parkway Preserve Area shall be recorded, as approved by the County Attorney's Office, the Engineering Department, and the Planning Division. The conservation easement for the 100' Lyons Road Rural Parkway Preserve Area shall contain:
    - a. A Rural Parkway Landscape Plan that conforms with the approved Rural Parkway Landscape Plan, but not be limited to the following items:
      - 1) Flowering trees;
      - 2) Undulating berms, no taller than five feet and landscaped with native vegetation; and,
      - 3) Benches/pedestrian gathering areas with a water fountain. At least two (2) pedestrian gathering areas shall be provided within the 100- foot wide Lyons Road Rural Parkway along this project frontage.
    - b. The Rural Parkway easement shall not include:
      - 1) Walls;
      - 2) structures with the exception of a bus shelter, benches/pedestrian gathering area, and water fountains.
    - c. The Rural Parkway easement may include:
      - 1) A bus easement,

- 2) Other drainage/utility easements may only be permitted which transverse (run perpendicular to) the Lyons Road Rural Parkway Easement to place drainage/utilities in the developable portion of the PUD, and,
  - 3) Other drainage easements may be permitted in the Rural Parkway Easement for the purposes of draining the Rural Parkway, subject to approval by the County Engineering Department and the Planning Division.
- d. A maintenance agreement for continual maintenance of the Rural Parkway that will contain language allowing for the transfer of maintenance to the Homeowners Association or a deed to the County for the County's ownership and maintenance.
  - e. Title insurance for this easement shall be provided to Palm Beach County subject to approval by the County Attorney and in an amount acceptable to the Department of Environmental Resources Management and the Planning Division.
  - f. Should the 100-foot wide Lyons Road Rural Parkway conservation easement not be placed on this property in a form acceptable to the County Attorney, Engineering Department, and Planning Division, prior to September 1st, 2008, then the approval of this Development Order (DO) shall be scheduled for review by the Board of County Commissioners with a recommendation by staff to revoke the Development Order. (PLAT/DATE: PLANNING/MONITORING - Planning)
9. Should conservation easements not be recorded for the Preservation properties in a form acceptable to the County Attorney prior to September 1st, 2008, then the approval of this Development Order (DO) shall be scheduled for review by the Board of County Commissioners with a recommendation by staff to revoke the Development Order. No administrative time extension for this condition shall be allowed. (DATE: MONITORING/PLANNING/ENG/CO ATTY - Planning)
  10. Prior to the issuance of the 200th Certificate of Occupancy, the property owner shall complete construction of the Rural Parkway according to the approved landscape plan. (CO: MONITORING - Planning)
  11. Prior to final approval by the Development Review Officer (DRO), the site plan shall indicate a pedestrian pathway along the lake fronting the recreation tract. This pedestrian pathway shall provide continuous circulation between the sidewalks within the north and south ROW. In addition, a minimum of two (2) benches shall be placed at this location. (DRO: PLANNING - Planning)
  12. Prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy (CO), the property owner shall pave pedestrian connections from the development area to the Rural Parkway Easement at the two locations shown on the certified master plan that read "pedestrian gathering area" with a break in any walls, landscaping, or buffering. (CO: MONITORING - Planning)
  13. The two pedestrian connections to the Rural Parkway at the locations shown on the certified master plan that read "pedestrian gathering area" may be controlled by gates or other security devices that may be controlled only by the property owner/developer/Homeowners Association of the PUD.

However, in no case, shall a gate or security device at these locations not provide access to the Rural Parkway by being rendered inoperable or non-functional. (ONGOING: CODE ENF - Planning)

### PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT

1. Prior to the recordation of the first plat, all property included in the legal description of the petition shall be subject to a Declaration of Restrictions and Covenants acceptable to the County Attorney's office which shall include the following:
  - a. formation of a single "master" property owner's association, automatic voting membership in the master association by any party holding title to any portion of the subject property, and assessment of all members of the master association for the cost of maintaining all common areas.
  - b. all recreation parcels shall be deed restricted to recreation for the use of the residents of the development. At the time of turnover of the POA/HOA, the recreation parcel shall be turned over to the association at no cost to the residents.
  - c. the property shall not be subject to the Declaration of Restrictions in phases. Approval of the Declaration must be obtained from the County Attorney's office prior to the recordation of the first plat for any portion of the planned development. This Declaration shall be amended when additional units are added to the PUD. (PLAT: CO ATTY - Zoning)
  
2. The property owner shall include in homeowners documents as well as written sales brochures, sales contracts, master plans and related site plans a disclosure statement identifying and notifying of the existence of active agricultural uses in the vicinity of the development. The property owner shall submit documentation of compliance with this condition on an annual basis to the Monitoring Section of Planning, Zoning and Building beginning on December 15, 2006, and shall continue on an annual basis until all units within the development have been sold or the property owner relinquishes control to the homeowners association. (DATE: MONITORING - Zoning)

### SCHOOL BOARD

1. The property owner shall post a notice of annual boundary school assignments for students from this development. A sign 11" X 17" shall be posted in a clear and visible location in all sales offices and models with the following:

**"NOTICE TO HOME BUYERS/TENANTS AND  
PARENTS OF SCHOOL AGE CHILDREN"**

School age children may not be assigned to the public school closest to their residences. School Board policies regarding levels of service or other boundary policy decisions affect school boundaries. Please contact the Palm Beach County School District Boundary Office at (561) 434-8100 for the most current school assignment(s). (ONGOING: SCHOOL BOARD - School Board)

2. Prior to the issuance of the first Certificate of Occupancy (CO), the school bus shelter shall be constructed by the petitioner in a location and manner acceptable to the Palm Beach County School Board and the County

Engineer. Provisions for the bus shelter shall include, at a minimum, a covered area, continuous paved pedestrian and bicycle access from the subject property or use, to the shelter. Maintenance of the bus shelter(s) shall be the responsibility of the residential property owner. (CO: MONITORING SCHOOL BOARD/ENG - School Board)

#### UTILITIES

1. If any relocations/modifications to the County's existing facilities are required that are a direct or indirect result of the development, the developer shall pay for the complete design and construction costs associated with these relocations/modifications. (ONGOING: PBCWUD - PBCWUD)

#### COMPLIANCE

1. In granting this approval, the Board of County Commissioners relied upon the oral and written representations of the petitioner both on the record and as part of the application process. Deviations from or violation of these representations shall cause the approval to be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for review under the compliance condition of this approval. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
2. Failure to comply with any of the conditions of approval for the subject property at any time may result in:
  - a. The issuance of a stop work order; the issuance of a cease and desist order; the denial or revocation of a building permit; the denial or revocation of a Certificate of Occupancy; the denial of any other permit, license or approval to any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; the revocation of any other permit, license or approval from any developer, owner, lessee, or user of the subject property; revocation of any concurrency; and/or
  - b. The revocation of the Official Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment, and/or any other zoning approval; and/or
  - c. A requirement of the development to conform with the standards of the ULDC at the time of the finding of non-compliance, or the addition or modification of conditions reasonably related to the failure to comply with existing conditions; and/or
  - d. Referral to code enforcement; and/or
  - e. Imposition of entitlement density or intensity.

Staff may be directed by the Executive Director of PZ&B or a Code Enforcement Special Master to schedule a Status Report before the body which approved the Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment, and/or other zoning approval, in accordance with the provisions of Article 2.E of the ULDC, in response to any flagrant violation and/or continued violation of any condition of approval.

Appeals of any departmental administrative actions hereunder may be taken to the Palm Beach County Board of Adjustment or as otherwise provided in the Unified Land Development Code (ULDC), as amended. Appeals of any revocation of an Official Zoning Map Amendment, Conditional Use, Requested Use, Development Order Amendment or other actions based on

a Board of County Commission decision shall be by petition for writ of certiorari to the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit. (ONGOING: MONITORING - Zoning)
