And It Is Not Good News for Palm Beach County



Florida writes most of the flood insurance policies in U.S. Palm Beach County writes the most policies in Florida



Why the Changes?

- NFIP has been operating in the red for years
- Too many subsidized policies that don't reflect true flood risk
- Extraordinary flood claims
- Borrowing from Treasury





Contingent on changes in accordance with Flood Insurance Reform Act passed by Congress in 2012 (Biggert Waters Act)

The Act:

- Eliminates subsidies
- Raises rates on certain classes of properties over time



Who Will Be Affected & When?





Owners of subsidized non-primary residences in Special Flood Hazard Areas 25% increase annually until rates reflect true risk.



Effective October 2013

Owners of subsidized properties in categories below: 25% rate increase annually:

- Severe repetitive properties or cumulative losses exceeding value of structure
- Commercial properties in Special Flood Hazard Areas
- Substantially damaged or substantially improved properties



No Change:

Owners of Primary residences in SFHAs will keep their subsidized rates <u>unless or until</u>:

- Property is sold (new rates charged to next owner)
- Policy elapses
- Property suffers severe, repeated losses
- Purchase a new policy



Effective Late 2014

Properties with current NFIP policies affected by map changes will increase 20% per year over 5 years

Note:

Palm Beach County is expecting to receive new Preliminary NFIP FIRM maps in Spring of 2014.

History of Map Development

- 1999 Initial Preliminary Maps Rolled Out
- 2000 Local Governments Object to Maps
- 2000 FEMA Agrees to Redo Maps
- 2001 2013
 - Lidar Issues
 - New FEMA Consultant
 - Hurricane Katrina HHD Issues
 - Funding Issues
 - -L-40 Levee Certification

FEMA Map Development History (Cont'd)

May 31, 2013 Preliminary Maps Rolled Out

July 31, 2013 Technical Reps Meet with FEMA

August 8, 2013 Review Period Extended- Nov. 30th

August 2013-Mid 2014 Agencies Work With FEMA

Spring/Summer 2014 New Preliminary Maps
