#### **Description:**

Racial and ethnic microaggressions are everyday insults, indignities, and demeaning messages sent to Black, Indigenous, and other People of Color (BIPOC) by typically well-intentioned people who are unaware of the hidden messages being sent to them (Sue et al., 2007). While seemingly small or insignificant, for BIPOC and particularly for youth who experience these continually, there are significant consequences to their mental and physical health, academic and economic wellbeing, and overall livelihood. This presentation will define implicit bias and microaggressions in the context of race and ethnicity as well as explore the impact on youth of color and those who work with youth. Finally, it will provide strategies for coping with racial stress as well as mitigating the impact of implicit bias.

### **Learning Objectives:**

At the conclusion of the training, participants will be able to:

- 1) Define implicit bias and racial/ethnic microaggressions.
- 2) Describe the impact of implicit bias and racial/ethnic microaggressions on the wellbeing of BIPOC and youth of color.
- 3) Identify ways to cope with racial bias and stress and mitigate the impact of implicit bias.

#### **Presenter:**



Dr. Danniella Jones earned her bachelor's in psychology at Berry College in Rome, Georgia and her doctorate degree in clinical psychology at Spalding University in Louisville, Kentucky. Dr. Jones completed her doctoral internship at Cherokee Health Systems, an integrated primary care and community mental health center in Tennessee and her post-doctoral fellowship with Palm Beach County Youth Services Department at Highridge Family Center. She then worked as a Psychologist at the Youth Services Department's Education & Training Center providing clinical services, supervising doctoral trainees, and providing presentations. Dr. Jones is currently a psychologist at GlobeCoRe Psychological and Global Consulting Services where she provides a variety of services in both Georgia and Florida. In her role, she provides individual, family and group therapy, psychological evaluations, and clinical supervision and consultation. In addition, she is a certified Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT) therapist. Dr. Jones offers workshops and trainings to the community on topics related to equity, diversity, and inclusion and trauma. Dr. Jones has been featured and broadcasted on several local platforms such as WPEC CBS 12 news and PBC channel 20 news stations to provide information on racial and ethnic implicit bias and microaggressions. She was also interviewed on the People of Power podcast and has written blogs featured on the Children Service's Council EveryParent website and app discussing how to talk to children about race and racism. Dr. Jones is passionate about working with underserved, diverse individuals and families as well as those who have been exposed to trauma and/or adversity. She supports clients through concerns related to parenting, depression, substance misuse, and identity exploration and her aim is to reduce the stigma of mental health in marginalized communities and increase access to services.
