





Purpose:

The Summer Camp Scholarship Program (SCSP) provides full-tuition and fees for summer camp for children residing in families with income at or below 185% of Federal Poverty Guidelines or who meet priority criteria (including foster care, homeless, or involvement with the delinquency systems).

Funding for the SCSP is provided through a partnership of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners and the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County. Friends of Youth Services & Palm Beach County, Inc. serves as the fiscal agent responsible for managing funds and retaining financial records.

Program Summary:

SCSP pays full-tuition for eligible children to attend day camp during the summer months. Camps across Palm Beach County are encouraged to apply to be a Summer Camp Scholarship site and offer educational, recreational, and other programming to meet the needs of Palm Beach County children.

SCSP was established in 1995 under the Palm Beach County Community Services Department's Community Action initiative as a means to ensure children, especially children whose parents have to work and those experiencing homelessness, remained safe while out of school. In 2015, the SCSP became a part of Palm Beach County Youth Services Department's Outreach and Community Programming Division.



Palm Beach County Youth Services Department assumed the SCSP in 2015. The SCSP database was created in 2018.







Camp Reimbursement:

- Camp must be offered 5 days per week (exceptions: county-observed holiday or natural disaster)
- Campers must attend a minimum of 12 hours per week for camps to qualify for reimbursement
- Regular & Specialty Camps = \$130 per camper per week
- Education Enrichment Camps = \$150 per camper per week
- Special Needs Camps = \$350 per camper per week






2023 Educational Enrichment Camp Sites:






Educational Enrichment Camps:


