Education & Training Center

Program Overview

The Education and Training Center is a community resource for primary prevention through education. training, and professional development. Free services are provided to parents, children, families, school personnel, and mental health professionals in Palm Beach County.

Clinical Services

- Family therapy services are offered to families and youth up to age 22
- Group therapy may be provided based on community needs
- Individual therapy services are offered to youth ages 18-22
- Parenting is offered in evidence-based individual and group formats
- Psychological evaluations may be provided to youth already involved in the department's clinical services

Training & Community Outreach

The Education and Training Center is responsible for developing and implementing trainings, workshops, and community outreach activities and is approved to offer continuing education units to licensees in various mental health disciplines. The site also trains doctoral interns, postdoctoral fellows, and doctoral and master's level practicum students. The internship program is accredited by the American Psychological Association.

Youth & Family Counseling (YFC)

Program Overview

The Youth and Family Counseling Program is a three to four month community-based program providing free therapeutic services for families with children and youth up to age 22.

Family Violence Intervention Program

- The Family Violence Intervention Program (FVIP) is a court diversion program for first time juvenile offenders who have been charged with domestic battery/assault.
- The program focuses on the unique problems of each family whose child has committed domestic violence.
- The juvenile must agree to attend an anger management group or individual and family counseling as assessed by the program.

Highridge Family Center

Program Overview

Highridge Family Center offers a three to four month, weekday residential treatment program for Palm Beach County youth, ages 11-16, who are experiencing problems at home, school, with friends or in the community. School instruction is provided on campus and in a small classroom setting by the School District.

Trauma-Informed Care

Highridge Family Center is certified by Sanctuary Model of trauma informed care. Our trauma informed programming focuses on creating a safe and supportive environment where healing from adversity occurs by fostering resilience through healthy relationships.

Residential Setting

- Trauma informed programming that focuses on home, school and peer issues
- Program participants stay in a dormitory style "house" of up to 12 youth per dorm
- Five dorms comprised of three male and two female dorms
- Twenty-four hour supervision
- Nursing staff available on each shift to address medical concerns
